TARHEEL SWINE GROWERS FACING FEED SHORTAGE

Scarcity of fishmeal and tankage has created a feeding problem for North Carolina hog producers reports Ellis V Vestal Extension swine specialist of N. C. State College. These two feeds have been the standard protein supplement used by swine growers for years.

Some farmers says Vestal are inclined to feed corn or other grain exclusively as a result of the shortage. The feeding of corn, however, is very expensive. It requires approximately 112 bushels of shell corn to produce 100 pounds of pork when the corn is fed alone. It requires only 61 bushels of corn to produce the same quantity of pork when the corn is fed with a mixture of fishmeal and tankage.

A comparison of the cost of the two methods shows that the use of fishmeal and tankage is about 80 percent more expensive than the use of a mixture of fishmeal and tankage.

Although fishmeal and tankage will probably continue to be scarce, the use of a mixture of fishmeal and tankage is still the best method of feeding hogs. It is also the most economical method.
