

**Otto Hehn Improves
Phifer Homestead**

Otto Hehn, the inventor who has greatly improved the motion picture screen with his Retroscope, curved glass screen has also greatly improved the home of his father-in-law, Tom Phifer, on the thirty road. The Phifer residence has been remodelled, painted and can now be attractively seen from the highway. A Kentucky fence has been erected around the homestead, and driveway laid out. Grass has been planted to enhance the beauty of the surrounding.

Mr. Hehn said: "I like to do things and improving the Phifer property gave me an outlet for my energy as I can not carry on my experimental work due to shortage of needed material."

The inventor who originated the Retroscope, which is featured in the most important contribution to motion picture since sound, spent his months in a tireless construction of the new driveway to say as regards to his improvement.

Mr. Hehn, who will make his home with the Phifers, for the duration, will be working on television, but the research will have to wait until after the war.

Mr. Hehn's research extends to both the Sparks-Withering Corp. of Jackson, Mich. and the Owens Corning Fiberglass Corp. of Toledo, Ohio.

Mr. Hehn is a member of the American Legion having fought in the last world war with 1st Grand Division of Philadelphia and was assigned to President Wilson as special interpreter for the American Legion.

October 4th**

So the problem of Church attendance has to be solved before any increase in the influence and work of the Church in the world can be noted. This problem will not be solved by so easy a method as holding a world communion service.

However, such a service is a challenge to ALL Christians to BEGIN NOW to serve with earnestness and sacrifice. The world conditions under which this communion is to be observed will add to its significance and seriousness. How imperative, therefore, that every Christian come to his Church on this day for here is the Christian's place of commitment, here is his altar that calls him to a deeper devotion and sacrifice in the work of his Lord and Master.

No true Christian can look with out sympathy on the people of the world who are faced with such appalling suffering and agony and oppression. And the WAY OUT of all is the WAY that takes men back to God. Here in a World-Wide Communion is an immediate opportunity for all Christian to BEGIN NOW to point the desperate and hopeless world to the one Power adequate to cope with the vexed questions and problems of war and to

decide that there is a greater source of Power than chips and guns and tanks and planes, and to recognize that true and abiding strength derives from communion with God.
