#### **1943 Cotton Insurance 4 hanges Are Announced**

Several changes wit, be made in the cotton crop incarance program to be made available to North Caron according to E. Y. Floyd, state AAA executive assistant at State College

As a result of recommendations made at conferences between repde erptatives of the AAA and officials of the Federal Crop Insurance Corporation. Floyd said. a reduced premium plan will be provided in next year's contracts Under this lan. the premium rate for any individual grower will be reduced to 50 per cent when that grower has paid to the Corporation an amount in premiums equal to his insurable yield for one year All premiums and in demnities are in terms of pounds of time cotton

Also under the 1943 plan, premium rates are to be determined on a

#### farm tests, and an adjustment of Cold Months Demand production will be made in case of a loss on tracts varying greatly in productivity, soil type, or farming

Among the other important chan lared is the increase in allowance or loss of seed to 20 percent.

Under this provision, a farmer add 20 percent to the amount he will receive in payment to cover the luss of the seed. Flord said. The Stogram for 1943, as in former years, is designed to assure the cut ton grower a steady income, especicity in years when he suffers a loss due to causes over which he has no. control

Flord said premium rates and yields which may be insured by any individual grower now are beng pre pared, and that forms for filing applications for crop insurance will be available in county AAA offices in the near future Cotton crop insurance was made available in this state for the first time in 1942, and more than 11,000 growers insured their vields
