Dried Beans Are Delicious

THERE'S no end to the appetite appeal you can put into hearty soups and main dishes made with dried beans, peas, lentils and other legumes. If you will remember this: Give special attention to the seasoning of these dishes to step up their bland flavor. Balance their heartiness by the color, texture, and tang of a crisp salad served with them. Combine them in one dish with or serve them with such meats as hamburger, canned pork and ham loaf, frankfurters, sausage, liver, chicken, etc.

These vegetables have the added virtue of being an inexpensive and valuable source of protein and a nutritious diet, although they cannot entirely take the place in our daily meals of the higher quality proteins found in meat, eggs, fish, cheese, poultry and milk. But today each meal that uses legumes for its main dish helps increase the supply of meat and other protein foods needed by our armed forces and for shipment to our allies abroad.

Try these recipe on your family:

Baked Bean Special
 (page 422)
 1 cup minced green pepper 1 No. 1 can sliced, peeled canned tomatoes 2 cups sliced onion 1/2 cup minced onion 1/2 cup medium sliced tomatoes 1/2 cup salt
 1 No. 1 can drained kidney beans 1/2 cup onion 1/2 cup medium sliced tomatoes 1/2 cup salt
 Sauté green pepper and onions in salad oil in a skillet until tender. Arrange with beans and sliced tomatoes in alternate layers in a 1 1/2 qt. casserole, sprinkling each layer with some of the salt and onion sugar. Sprinkle 1/2 cup of drained bean liquor over beans, salt covered. In a moderate hot oven of 350° F. for 30 min. Uncover; bake 5 min. longer. Serves 6.

Some with salad bowl of cabbage, onions and canned pineapple, cornstarch and tea for luncheon.

Split Pea Soup
 (page 125)
 1 1/2 c. dried split peas 1 cup celery salt 1 c. cold water 1 cup salt 1/2 c. sliced onion 1/2 cup pepper 1/2 c. sliced onion 1/2 cup salt 1/2 c. sliced onion 1/2 cup salt 1/2 c. sliced onion 1/2 cup salt
 Soak dried peas overnight in 2 c. of cold water. Drain. Sauté the onion until tender in 1 tbsp. of fat or fat cut from the bone. Add ham bone, drained peas, celery salt, salt, pepper, and the remaining 6 c. cold water. Cover, bring to a boil, and then simmer gently for 3 hrs. Remove ham bone and all surface fat. Make a thin white sauce by adding the flour to the remaining 1 1/2 c. of fat in the top of a double boiler. Add the milk and cook, stirring constantly until smooth, and occasionally for 10 min. longer. Combine with the soup, heat well, and serve. Serves 6-8.

Physical Instructors Wanted

Atlanta, Ga.—Opportunities for qualified men to become physical education instructors and instructors in history, mathematics, physics, political science and English at the Navy pre-flight schools were created today in an announcement of the itinerary of special interviewing officers for the program.

Captain M. C. Robertson, USN, director of Naval Officer Procurement for the Sixth Naval District announced that representatives of the Bureau of Aeronautics would be in Charleston, S. C., Nov. 20; Jacksonville, Fla., Dec. 1-2 and in Atlanta, Dec. 2-4 for the special interviews.

Those applying for commissions as physical education instructors should first obtain preliminary application papers from either the district headquarters in Atlanta or one of the branch offices, Captain Robertson said.

Physical education instructors qualifying for commissions must be qualified for Naval Aviation Flight Training, and possess a college degree or its equivalent in the field of physical education or its related fields. Furthermore, they must have a record of participation in athletic competition or possess special qualifications as athletic professionals, showing progress in their chosen fields of athletics.

Physical qualifications in accordance with the minimum standards for special service officers must be met and candidates must present outstanding appearance and officer-like qualifications.

Commissions will be made available to instructors in history, mathematics, physics, political science and English, who possess a college degree and college teaching experience in fields characteristic of Liberal Arts College. Graduate degrees are desirable.
