More About Hospital

Cont'd from front page) fill any vacancies which might occur in the board of trustees at any time, that said trustees shall serve without compensation but this provision shall not prevent members of said board from receiving reasonable compensation for any other service rendered said hospital.

Section 3 That the board of trustees of the Kings Mountain Memorial Hospital, upon their appointment and thereafter following each term election, shall meet and organize by electing from among their number a president, vice-president and shall elect a secretary and treasurer and such other officers and committees as said board may deem best, and said board of trustees as soon as sufficient funds are available and as soon as practical as possible select and acquire a site and erect thereon a hospital and equip the same.

Section 4 That the trustees of the Kings Mountain Memorial Hospital are authorized and directed to accept all of the personal property and real estate devised and bequeathed by Lottie Goforth to Mr. O. P. Lewis, Trustee, and the said Mr. O. P. Lewis, Trustee or his assigns, shall have the right and privilege of transferring to said trustees all of the property which might come into his hands from the Lottie Goforth estate, and thereby be relieved from any further legal responsibility in connection with same, that the said board of trustees shall use and dispose of said estate in compliance with the last will and testament of Miss Lottie Goforth, deceased.

Section 5 That the operation and management of the said Kings Mountain Memorial Hospital shall be under the control of its said board of trustees, and said board may take and prescribe by-laws and general regulations and rules governing the same; that the treasurer of said board shall give a bond in amount fixed by said board, and shall receive all money obtained by the operation of said hospital, or otherwise, and pay out the same under the orders of the board of trustees.

Section 6 That the board of trustees of the said Kings Mountain Memorial Hospital may establish and maintain in connection therewith, and as part of said hospital, a training school for nurses.

Section 7 That the said Kings Mountain Memorial Hospital, the grounds of same and all furniture, equipment, and property thereof, and the physicians, attendants, persons sick therein, and all persons approaching or coming within the limits of said hospital shall be subject to such rules and regulations as said board of trustees may prescribe.

Section 8 That this act shall be in force and effect from and after its ratification.

Ratified this the day of February, 1942.
