Par is five cans or bottles of raag cans containing less than eight ouces. like small cans of boby foor-Any amount over that total calls for a penalty.

A f. .. nity of four, for example, can declare 20 cams or bottles of traits. reactables, soups, and juices without losing any of its ration.

The size of these extra cans wont make any difference so long as 'they are \$ounce or larger. (Home-canned zooda dont count.)

There are 24 such 8 point bluecolored stamps in each book. If the family doesn't have enough of these to cover penalties, the glerk in to make a note of that fact on the books, and the remainder of the penalty would apply to any future

With your books in hand you'll be ready to start budgeting your buying—in points as well as cash. The blue stamps will be for unned and bottled goods; the red stamps to the same book wil used later for rationing meat


