

Section 5. That this shall be in full force and effect from and after its ratification.

AN ACT TO CORRECT THE DESCRIPTION OF THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF KINGS MOUNTAIN, N. C.

WHEREAS, there is a slight error in the course and dimensions of the corporate limits or boundary of the Town of Kings Mountain as defined by Chapter 10 of the Private Laws of North Carolina, Session 1923, and the purpose of this amendment is to correct said error, now therefore,

The General Assembly of North Carolina Do Enact:

Section 1. That line 9 of Section 2 of Chapter 10 of the Private Laws of North Carolina, Session 1923, which reads, "and runs S 5 1/2 W 12° 25' chains" shall be stricken out and the following substituted instead: "and runs S 49° W 12° 25' chains."

Section 2. That this act shall be in full force and effect from and after its ratification.

Ratified this the day of February 1943.
