PICTURE CIRCULAR ISSUED ON GARDENS

A new publication showing in pictures the step-by-step procedure in preparing and growing a garden has just been issued by the Extension Service of N. C. State College.

Prepared by Lewis P. Watson, the publication is designed to impress the gardener with the importance of proper preparation of the seed bed, the correct placement of fertilizer materials, the proper handling of seed and plants, and the necessity of good care in cultivating the plants during their growing period.

A free copy of this booklet may be obtained by writing to the Agricultural Editor, State College, Raleigh, and asking for Extension Circular No. 261—A Garden Guide.

The illustrated guide shows how a garden should be handled from the time the ground is broken to the time the vegetables are harvested. The methods described, according to Watson, are those which have been tried and found satisfactory under normal conditions.

Forty seven of the step-by-step pictures are contained in the 20 page circular which has an attractive cover page of tomatoes in color.

Women Take Over Guard Towers At State Prison

Raleigh—Four women are now manning the towers of the State Women's Prison here—the first women guards in the state's history.

Because the prison department is unable to get male guards, four of the men formerly stationed at woman's prison have been transferred to Central Prison Two of the women, Mrs. Beattie Williams and Mrs. J. C. Massengill, are wives of two of the guards transferred. Another Mrs. Estelle Cosby, whose husband was recently killed in a railroad accident, last worked in a local dry-cleaning establishment. The fourth, Mrs. Carole Jackson, also a widow has been operating a country store in Granville county.

Mrs. Ethel Strickland, first woman warden of the state, who took over as head of the women's prison a year ago, now heads a staff of 17 women now running that prison.

The women will not be armed and will wear simple slacks suits as uniforms.

Traffic 70 Percent Below Normal

Raleigh—James S. Durell, traffic engineer for the State Highway and Public Works Commission, reports January traffic was 70 percent below normal.

Durell said traffic during January 1943 was 56.5 percent below the same month in 1942. However, he pointed out, the railroads had already gone into effect during January 1942 and traffic that month was already 20 percent below Jan. 1941.

Declines of rural traffic amounting to some 65 percent, due to the OPA pleasure driving ban, have been reported, Durell stated.

"Reports indicate," he said, "those using the highways have found ways of evading the ban, and are using the highways as much as they did before it went into effect."

Durell pointed out that this applied only to highways and not conditions within the city limits.
