Every month an average of 702 freight trains, most of them carrying vital war goods, are delayed an average of 400 hours because of carelessness by the men and women who drive automobiles.

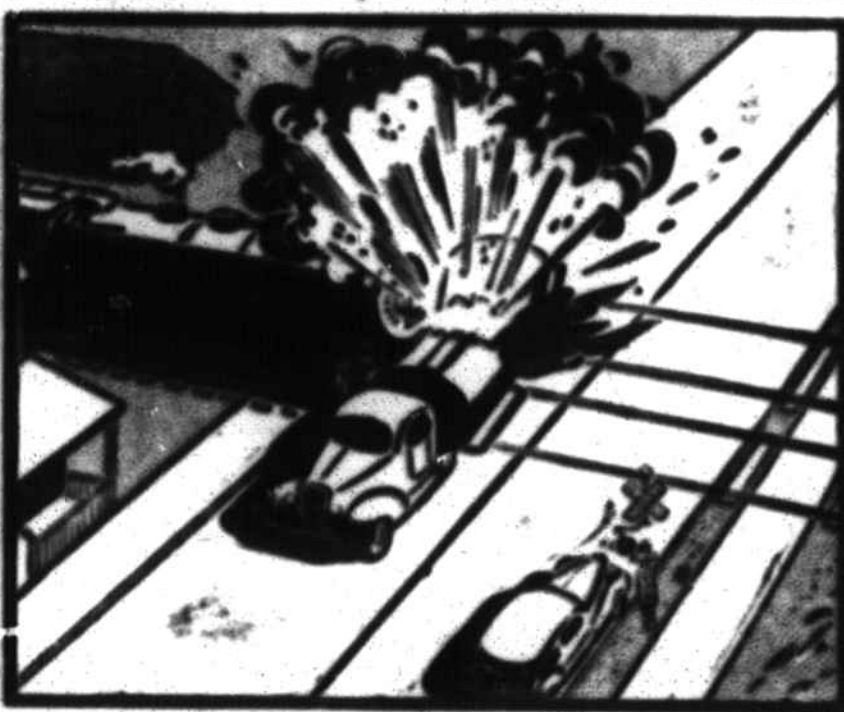
The grade crossing accident illustrated here is an example:

At 1:22 a.m. (more than 1,000 grade crossing accidents occurred at night last year) a freight train passed through a city in accordance with the speed limit. The locomotive's headlight glared through the darkness and the regulation whistle warnings were sounded.

The engine man saw a gasoline tank truck crossing immediately in front of the engine and, realizing the imminence of the accident, applied the air brakes, but was unable to stop in time. The impact tore the gasoline tank open. Gasoline ignited and exploded, killing the engine man, fireman and a brakeman, as well as the oil truck driver.

The locomotive and 27 freight cars and their contents were damaged by flames. Three homes nearby caught fire and burned, as well as two parked automobiles and one express truck.

The National Safety Council is



conducting a special campaign to stop these grade crossing accidents, which every day delay an average of 28 trains a total of 22 hours—a serious drain on the nation's war transportation effort. Driver carelessness is the cause

of almost all grade crossing accidents, according to the Council. To help win the war, to save yourself and others needless suffering, the Council asks you to be sure the track is clear before you start across.

NORTH CAROLINA WEEKLY WAR BOUND UP

COFFEE BY MAIL

North Carolina coffee drinkers who order their coffee by mail may now "pay" for the purchase by enclosing detached ration stamps with the order rather than the entire ration book. OPA has announced. Formerly, consumers were required to forward their Ration Book to the retailer or wholesaler for removal of stamps.

ICE BOX PRICES

Retail price ceiling on new ice boxes have been established by OPA by models for North Carolina. Present prices will be lowered in many cases. Three sets of retail ceilings have been provided: 1. Sales by ice companies and their stores, prices ranging from \$26.75 to \$75.00 delivered; 2. Mail order sales, \$18.95 to \$59.95; 3. All other sales at retail, \$31.25 to \$56.25.

MORE FARM MACHINERY

A total of 300,000 tons of carbon steel, with other materials in proportion has been allocated to the farm machinery program for the quarter beginning July 1. An additional 200,000 tons of steel have also been approved for each of the three quarters from Oct. 1, 1942, to July 1, 1944. During the third quarter of this year, special emphasis will be given to the manufacturer of harvesting machinery for this year's crops. The whole farm machinery program has been stepped up.

INSPECTION REQUIREMENTS CHANGED

The inspections for North Carolina commercial motor vehicles now may be made every 6,000 miles or every six months, whichever occurs first, OPT says. Previously, commercial vehicles had to have tire inspections every 6,000 miles or every 60 days, whichever occurred first.

DATA ON PRISONERS

American soldiers officially reported as prisoners of war in enemy countries to date total 17,082, the War Department has announced. Of these, 11,597 are held by Japan; 2,512 by Germany and 2,404 by Italy. However, these reports are incomplete. Information in the hands of the War Department indicates that the basic diet of an American soldier in German prison camps is largely potatoes, cabbage, fish, and an indefinite amount of meat.

TO SUBSTITUTE TIRES

Farmers in the State needing farm implements or front wheel tractor tires will be permitted to purchase suitable substitutes when they are unable to find a dealer with tires designed expressly for

their purpose, the OPA has announced. Dealers may also sell passenger car owners tires and tubes of a slightly different size than is called for by the rationing certificate.

LEATHER FOR CIVILIANS

Manufacture of many civilian leather products, which was prohibited after June 1, can be continued through 1943 out of manufacturers' inventories, under a recent WPA amendment. Among products affected are dress gloves and mittens, brief cases, new upholstery, radio cases, pocketbooks, handbags, cigar and cigarette cases, key cases, tobacco pouches, water straps and dog furnishings.

GAS COUPONS CHANGED

A new T gasoline coupon, which replaces the present Y coupon, will become valid for use on July 1. The old type of Y coupon will be invalid after July 25. OPA expects the change in design to help take up "slack" mileage and remove potential sources of black market gasoline.

Poison Flea Beetle On Irish Potatoes

Yields of potatoes in western North Carolina will be greatly reduced unless measures are taken to control the potato flea beetle, now threatening serious damage to the crop, says Walter M. Kulsh, assistant in the Department of Entomology of the Agricultural Experiment Station at State College.

He reports that the crop should have been treated either by dusting or spraying at an earlier date but that present prices of potatoes warrant a fight on the flea beetle now. For dusting, he recommends a mixture of one part of cryolite and three parts of talc. This mixture should be placed in a tight drum to gather with a few smooth river stones about the size of the flat to help mix the materials properly. Keep the drum tightly covered and rotate for a few minutes to get a thorough mix.

Kulsh recommends applications to be made until it is no longer possible to use the equipment in the field without damaging the plants by running over them.

He recommends that growers who prefer spraying use two 50 cc. of cyanide acetate in a 4-600 bar down mixture in their weekly applications.

The entomologist warns that the foliage of the plants must be completely covered with the dust or the spray to insure full protection against the flea beetle.

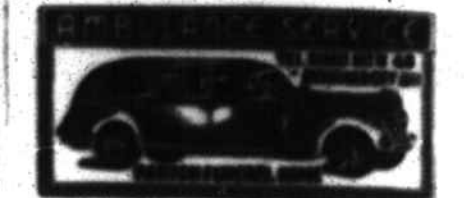
