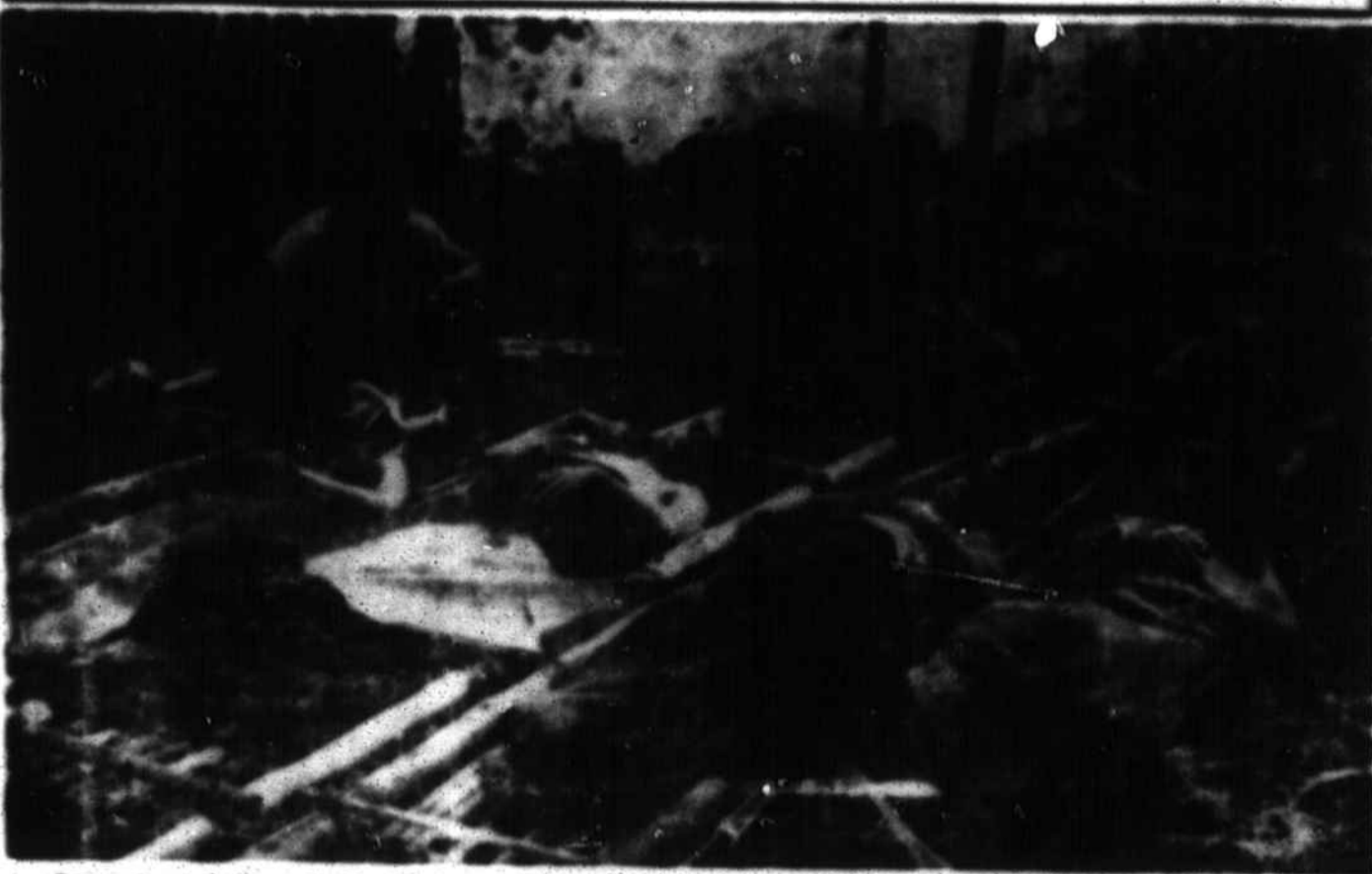


### A Substitute for Hell
