

### Woman Urged To Join WACs

The following statement by Major General William Byrd, Commanding General, Fourth Service Command, Atlanta, Ga., is made to the Women of the South:

Patriotic women of the South are offered the opportunity to serve their country as never before in history. In the All-States Women's Army Corps recruiting program.

If there has ever been any question in the mind of any qualified woman as to the real and urgent need for her services in the WACs it should be dispelled quickly by a review of the news concerning the drafting of fathers.

Every woman in the WAC is doing a man-sized job, releasing a man for more arduous field duties which we have not called upon our women to perform. Every woman who joins the WAC will find herself in a man-sized job, contributing a service to her country of which the need cannot be in question.

Therefore I urge all qualified women to challenge themselves—and meet the challenge of the appeal of their country for their help—and enroll in their state WAC group. ### CONSERVE RESOURCES

The demands of this world war have reached the point where conservation of resources on the home front is absolutely necessary. Savings in manpower, fuel, equipment and material must be made if we keep up the terrific production pace scheduled by military strategy.

It is estimated that a 10 percent reduction in domestic and commercial use of coal for heating would save over 20,000,000 tons annually; a 10 percent reduction in domestic and commercial use of electricity would save over 4,000,000 tons of coal or its equivalent and more than 75 million lamp bulbs; a ten percent reduction in the use of man-made gas would save over 1,500,000 barrels of fuel oil. In addition to these direct savings vast quantities of other critical materials as well as manpower would be released.

More baby carriages will be on sale next spring. WPA has given manufacturers permission to make as many as they can this year from materials now available. The probable increase will be 25,000.

### No More Reservations More Than 30 Days in Advance

As a wartime measure to provide better service for military and essential business travelers, the Southern Railway System, in concert with the Eastern Railroads has adopted a new plan for handling advance reservations for space in Pullmans and reserved seats in coaches. Effective at once, no reservations or requests for reservations will be accepted more than 30 days in advance.

With half the Pullmans and a third of the coaches assigned exclusively to troop movements, and with business travel at an all-time peak, there has been a shortage of train space throughout the country. This has been especially true during week ends and holidays, with thousands of men and women in uniform traveling on furlough and with business men seeking to make necessary trips without the loss of a business day.

Faced with the greatest transportation task in history, the railroads are tapping every resource of ingenuity and efficiency. Reservations bureaus are being expanded. Schools have been set up for training personnel. Available Pullmans and coaches are being serviced and turned around so speedily that cars now handle nearly four times their peacetime passenger volume.

The new 30 day reservation plan is the latest of these wartime efficiency steps. Added to the measures already taken, it should help to provide better service for all essential travel.

More than half a million radio receiving tubes for home sets have been channeled to civilian markets by the War Production Boards radio and radar division. Dealers can get these without restriction if they are to be used here at home, but under WPA order L-265 they must require a written certification from the purchaser.

### Soldier Paper in Italy

ATLANTA, Ga. — American soldiers in Italy are getting news from their own newspaper, the "Stars and Stripes," published by soldier personnel who went ashore in their own truck with a complete printing plant.

Reports reaching Headquarters, Fourth Service Command state that the portable printing plant is self-contained with radio receiving set, type and press, ready to go anywhere and get out an edition in a cave or a cornfield. The report which comes from Colonel Egbert White in charge, says the plant is manned by men who can, if necessary, use the weapons installed—machine guns, antiaircraft guns, pistols and Garand rifles.

"Stars and Stripes" is published weekly in five cities and daily in five other cities. Eight to 16 pages is the size—depending on the availability of newspaper. Aside from news printed for soldiers overseas, the editors use space as needed to knock off baseless rumors that are, according to them, "forever raining circulation."

### NO END TO REQUIREMENTS

As Chief of Staff, United States Army General George C. Marshall said last week: "There will be no end to requirements for weapons until the final battle is completed in victory—tanks, ps. trucks, air planes and artillery are inevitably destroyed by the hundreds on the battlefield, even when the going is good.

"The weapons and equipment must be replaced without delay if the advance is to continue and if we are to give the soldiers who depend on those weapons a fair break on the battlefield."

Weapons require steel, and steel requires scrap. Scrap metal must be found.

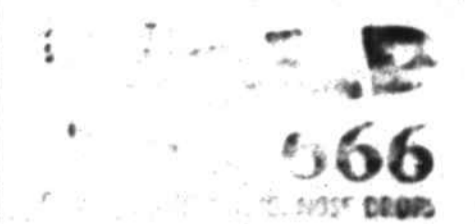

### HARVEST THE COTTON CROP

RALPH H. In expressing the hope that much cotton in North Carolina was allowed to go to waste in the fields last year, W. Earl Scott, Commissioner of Agriculture called on all friends of the farmer to harvest the cotton crop.

Scott said that delay in harvesting cotton after it reaches maturity not only lowers the quality of the lint but more important it reduces the value of the gin lints and gins that come from the seed.

He said that protein in lint is 26 percent short of need, and added that gin lints are also of fully important way materials.
