STOCKHOLM.—Heinrich Himmler, head of the German Schutzstaffel and Gestapo, and Gen. Wilhelm Bittrich, chief of staff of the Nazi Storm Troops, have issued a "back to religion" order to these fanatic Nazis.

These bodies were ordered to attend church services connected with Festivities at this time of the year and were told, "Through your attendance, the faithful will believe that National Socialism can cope easily with the church and religion."

The order came from the Nazi War Ministry of Heinrich Himmler's SS who had been brought up as atheists. The order has been issued by the order of the Nazi party.
