

Britain Declares War on Squirrels; Gives Advice

SQUIRRELS—It may be a tough war to the squirrels. The ministry of agriculture announced they are "giving good advice" adding that one can expect to see squirrel picnics appearing on hotel menus in the near future.

Typically English in its approach to the intriguing problem, the ministry gives more detail on how to kill the squirrels than what to do with them thereafter. Two guns and a dog are recommended as the best approach for would-be squirrel hunters. Land owners, incidentally, can be prosecuted for failing to declare war on the "beasts" which have been outlawed as pests this season.

Castro, Storm Troopers Go to Church on Order

STOCKHOLM—Heinrich Himmler, head of the German Schutzstaffel and Castro, and Gen. Wilhelm Schepmann, chief of staff of the Nazi Storm Troops, have issued a "back to religion" order to these formations.

These bodies were ordered to attend church services connected with festivities at this time of the year and were told, "Through your attendance, the faithful will believe that National Socialism can cooperate with the church and religion."

The majority of both Himmler's and Schepmann's troops had been busy at other jobs, but the order was to attend church services.
