Robert J. Lynn To Be Re-Assigned

MIAMI BEACH, Fla. — T-3 Robert J. Lynn, 24, of Shelby, N. C., returned from service outside the continental United States, now is being processed through the Army Air Force Redistribution Station No. 2 in Miami Beach, where his next assignment will be determined.

This is one of the Redistribution Stations within the AAF Personnel Distribution Command. At an AAF Redistribution Station, AAF returns from theaters of operation. It is examined by specially selected medical and classification officers whose joint findings are used in recommending new assignments. Some of the AAF Redistribution program is designation of each man to duty for which he is best fitted. Officers live at a Redistribution Station under conditions that encourage natural response to processing, the great or part of their two-week stay being devoted to rest and recreation.

AAF personnel, enlisted men and officers alike, are assigned to a Redistribution Station upon their return to the United States, but do not report to the station until completing a furlough or leave of three weeks.

Sergeant Lynn was a supply sergeant during 24 months in the Caribbean area. His wife, Valerie, resides at 1104 Morgan street in Shelby, and his father, R. S., at 210 Cleveland avenue in Kings Mountain. Sergeant Lynn attended Kings Mountain High School.
