

**Twelve-Year-Old Boy Out To Break Record; Sold \$373,300 in Three Previous Campaigns**

NEWARK, N. J. — With War Bond sales totaling \$373,300 to his credit in three previous drives, 12-year-old Carl J. Boehler, Jr. of Verona, N. J., is out to break his previous records during the third War Loan.

Accompanied by six attractive high school girls, whom he terms his "Bevy of Bond Boosters," Carl has started a round of schools, clubs, industries and community bond rallies, which will keep him busy throughout the drive.

The boy, who is believed to be America's champion school War Bond salesman, is a student at Our Lady of the Lake School in Verona. He started selling War Bonds during the Third War Loan and tallied \$5,450 in sales. During the Fourth War Loan he sold \$20,450 worth and during the Fifth \$278,400. His achievements have brought him a personal letter of commendation from President Roosevelt, a jeep ride and a plane ride in the famed flying fortress, "Hell's Angels," which downed 18 German fighter planes in 48 missions over occupied Europe.

Said to be a spellbinder, Carl "tells" his audience thoroughly at every appearance.

His achievement is the more remarkable because all sales have been made to individuals and the largest single sale was for \$10,000. Nearly all of the bonds he has sold have been in Series E.

Equally at home in a factory or a radio station Carl is known as "The Kid Behind the Man Behind the Gun" and "America's Premier Young War Bond Salesman."

The six high school girls who are accompanying him on the present tour of New Jersey circulate through the audiences and make actual sales after Carl finishes one of his appealing sales talks.

**State College Hints To Farm Homemakers**

Waxing heels and toes of stockings with a bit of candle is routine house-economy long ago in wooded shanties of Europe, and it is a practical way to meet stocking problems to day. Textile specialists who have put to laboratory tests this old-fashioned custom report that rubbing was on stockings makes them wear four times as long before holes appear in heels or toes.

Tests showed the simplest and most effective method is merely rubbing a piece of candle wax or paraffin on heels and toes before each wearing. Even if the waxing is not repeated until after several launderings, enough wax remains to make stockings last more durable.

If only a thin film of wax is applied, it will not interfere with the proper laundering of the stockings or change their appearance.

Mops and other cleaning material should have their own hooks or shelves in the closet. Built-in metal containers for such things as oil mops heads lessen the danger of spontaneous combustion.

One out of three accidental deaths from poison is a child under five. Keep poisons out of reach or locked up.

In the fall rats and mice might enter your house, but the alert householder will look for their places of entrance, place traps and poison, and close all entrances.

A 150 million bushel crop of sorghums, principally hays and milo, is being grown on Southwestern acres which a few years ago were officially consigned to become desert.

**SEQUOIA POTATO IN FIGHT FOR TOP SPOT**

The Sequoia, an Irish potato bred by the Agricultural Experiment Station at State College, is replacing old established varieties of potatoes in the Florida area and is battling for first place with the Sebago, another variety with an Indian name, say reports from the Sunshine State.

Both are light-skinned potatoes. The skin of the Sequoia is clean while the Sebago has russet patches. The latter potato is more subject to late blight than is the Sequoia but the yields of both varieties are good.

The Sequoia has received wide acclaim since it was first introduced just a few years ago in experimental plantings. This variety is now being widely planted in Maine, the Middle West, California, Hawaii, and in Australia.

The Sequoia gives exceptionally high yields and excellent quality potatoes in the Mountain and Coastal portions of North Carolina but the crop develops a little too late in Eastern Carolina to get the potatoes on the early market.

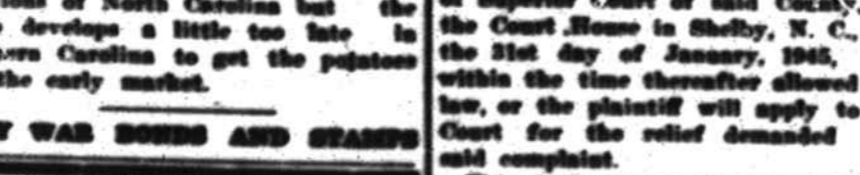
