Unconscious Parachuter  
Mrs. Murray's Cousin

Lt. Keith Hudson, of High Point, who, according to a press dispatch of July 16, parachuted while unconscious from a stricken B-29 Super Fortress on a cross-country flight. is a cousin of Mrs. Boyer Murray and has other relatives in Kings Mountain, it was learned this week. The huge B-29 was abandoned by its nearly asphyxiated crew at an altitude of 9,500 feet. Lt. Hudson, already overcome by gasoline fumes, was pushed out of the plane by the pilot. The rush of air revived Hudson, but he was injured in landing, as was one other member of the crew. Other members of the crew were rescued from the woods of Northern Minnesota and a nearby lake.
