NEW WAR STAMPS
Five more red stamps in War Ration Book Four will become valid next Monday, Oct. 1. It was announced yesterday by Chairman W. B. Blakely of the local War Price and Rationing Board.

He reminded that red stamps V2, W2, X2, Y2, and Z2, now valid, would expire at midnight, Sunday, Sept. 30. The new valid stamps, good until Jan. 31, 1946, will be E1, S1, T1, U1, and V1 the chairman said.

Sugar Stamp No. 38 remains valid for five pounds through the end of the year, it was stated. Mr. Blakely called attention once more to the fact that OPA skipped Sugar Stamp No. 37 due to the fact that many householders erroneously used it last year in applying for canning sugar.

Airplane stamps 1, 2, 3 and 4 in War Ration Book Three remain valid indefinitely for shoes.

TIRE SITUATION ACUTE
Demand for passenger car tires has increased so rapidly since the lifting of gasoline rationing that it will be many months before motorists get all the new tires they need, OPA District Director L. W. Driscoll announced yesterday in Charlotte.

He said that unfilled applications for passenger car tires are at an all-time high, while inventories are at an all-time low the country over.

It is expected that the backlog of approved but unfilled applications may total one million for the country by the end of September.

"These are all applications that have been approved, but local boards can't issue certificates for their purchase because passenger tire quotas have been exhausted," he said.

This explains, he declared, why local boards are forced to turn down thousands of tire applications.

POINTS OFF CHEESE
Chairman Blakely of the Local War Price and Rationing Board reminded housewives yesterday that all cheese point values have been reduced to zero.

AUTO SEAT COVERS
Price relief measures have been granted manufacturers of low-priced automobile seat covers in an effort to get these scarce items back on the market, it was announced yesterday by OPA District Director L. W. Driscoll in Charlotte.

"The fabric supply is now loosening up to the point where military entanglements in textile manufacturing are felt and normal production should soon be resumed in this industry with a normal spread over the entire price range," Mr. Driscoll said.

ment, demand for seat covers has increased while shortages have developed in the low-priced lines, he added.

BUILDING BOOM CONTINUES
Some details on OPA's most far-reaching peace-time price control program have been released by OPA regional officials in Atlanta with the declaration "building material costs must and will be stabilized."

"One look at the record of what happened after the last war is enough to show why this program is so vital: 68,000 mortgage failures on homes in 1926; 97,000 in 1927; 116,000 in 1928; 134,000 in 1929."

Commenting on these figures a few days ago, OPA Administrator Chester Bowles said, "That's what happens when a building boom goes bust."

Authority has been received from Washington empowering regional OPA officials to set community dollar-and-cent ceiling prices on construction materials and building costs in each area. These will be decided upon after a survey has been completed to determine what costs need to be flat-priced and where.

An "unprecedented boom" in building is anticipated, according to OPA, and regional officials said that before long a person could consult a chart in his area and determine how much it will cost to modernize a bathroom, put a new roof on the garage or barn, or build a whole house.
