HORTON'S SHIP BACK

Aboard the Battleship USS WISCONSIN, San Francisco. — Ben Earl Horton, seaman, second class, USNB, Kings Mountain, N. C., made a long voyage back to the States from Tokyo Bay with this 45,000 ton IOWA class ship for her participation in the observance of Navy Day Oct. 27.

The WISCONSIN figured prominently in the actions during the final eight months of the war, supporting 3rd Fleet operations in the Leyte and Luzon invasions, taking part in 5th Fleet raids against Honshu and the Ryukyus in support of the Iwo Jima operation, joining the 3rd and 5th Fleet supporting operations at Okinawa, and making strikes with the 3rd Fleet against the home islands of Japan.

She climaxed her battle career by dropping anchor in Tokyo Bay at the cessation of hostilities.

Lonnie Venoy Brooks, Flc, has been honorably discharged from the navy. Fireman Brooks served 18 months on shore duty in South America.

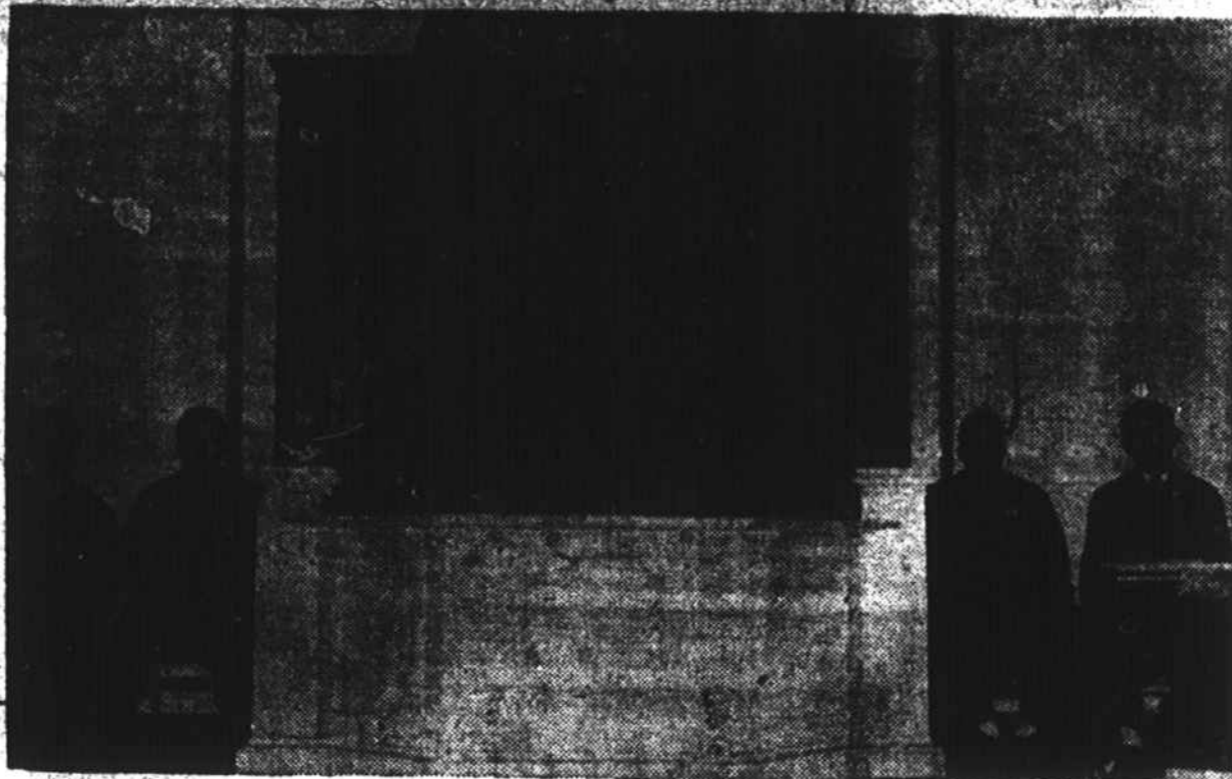
