

Industry Here Can Handle Labor Supply, Says Official

USES Employment Service Kings Mountain industries can ad equately take care of the local labor upply as expansion programs are out into effect within the next few months, for as building materials and other supplies become available there will be many job openings.

One of the greatest problems in the community now is the housing short

During the past year the local U. S. Employment Service has had a large volume of activity as is shown by the following data:

The number of persons appearing at the Kings Mountain U. S. Employ ment Service during 1945 was 5,211. During August and September of 1945, following VJ Day, the number coming into the office decreased but the following months have shown an increase.

Of the total number coming in 1,-586 were placed in jobs in local plants which were making materials vital to the war effort.

During the period of January through August of 1945 employers listed the majority of job openings with the Employment Service and up through August there were 2,000 job openings listed.

The last three months of 1945 saw a rapid decline in job openings. A great deal of this drop was due to the lifting of all hiring restrictions and also to the fact that workers were more inclined to "stick" to their jobs, fearing that the demand for workers would not be so great as

during the peak of war production. During January 1946 the local office had 635 reception contacts 443 of these contacts were by persons seeking employment. 415 of the contacts were by veterans of W. W. II. These veterans came seeking jobs or Carolina in 1946. to secure information regarding train ing or other services available

Placements on jobs so far in 1946 have fallen far below 1945 Many veterans are seeking jobs not availa-ble in Kings Mountain. Many are wanting to train for new jobs others have not decided what type of work they want. Others are returning to their old jobs after short period. Several veterans have entered business for themselves.

The number of claims for Veterans Readinstment Allowance has been very small compared to the number of veterans discharged in this area. Veterans are experiencing great difficulty in regard to housing. Some have had to refuse jobs because no housing or transportation could be worked out.

The housing situation has also affected -non-voteran workers and local plants are experiencing difficulty in filling jobs due to this condition.

In spite of the large number of job seekers, the local office has had Unemployment Compensation. This, it seems, shows that workers in this area are really seeking jobs and are willing to work during the reconversion period just as they did during the war period.

The U. S. Employment Service has completed its change to peacetime activity and has already started on its program of helping reconversion in the community in its services to veterans, war workers and all employ-

Employers are urged to keep the ocal office informed of job openings in order that we can be of better ser vice to them as well as to the unemployed worker who is seeking employ

In the last year of the war the expenditures for military purposes in the Fourth Service Command averaged \$250,000,000 per month.

The Fourth Service Command is an agency of the Army Service Forces and handles all military matters pertaining to supply, housing and transportation of soldiers in the states of Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Mississ ippi, North Carolina, South Carolina and · Tennessee.

At the peak traning load in the Fourth Service Command ten Quarter master Market Centers were establish ed, purchasing millions of dollars worth of perishable foods, Since P.J Day, that number has been cut to


