

**SOIL CONSERVATION NEWS**

Rush Hayle of the Dedmon community is mighty proud of the alfalfa he seeded last fall. He says: "There is one thing wrong with my alfalfa message—it just isn't large enough. This fall, plan to put in two additional acres." His next door neighbor, Mr. E. G. Clark, is also well pleased with his newly-seeded alfalfa. These two Cleveland County farmers have worked out Soil Conservation Service farm plans with the Broad River soil conservation district.

J. W. Watterson of Route 1 Kings Mountain says: "Folks who say that cattle won't eat lespedeza sericea visit my farm and get the surprise of their lives, because my cows head straight for the sericea lot when I turn them in the pasture." Mr. Watterson has about six acres of sericea which he uses to supplement his pasture grasses during early spring and June grazing. Besides being a good grazing plant, it is one of the best soil erosion control plants.

Pane Allen of the Dedmon community recently top-dressed his permanent pasture with a complete fertilizer and added to his mixture of grasses annual lespedeza and Dallis grass seeds.

The district will distribute three hundred pounds of lespedeza sericea and lespedeza bicolor seeds to farmers having tractor conservation farm plans for wildlife planting. The planting will be made around the edge of fields in the form of a border strip approximating 25 feet wide.

The following are some of the farmers who will prepare the strips for wild life and soil conservation: G. T. Cabanis, E. L. Carpenter, Paul Yates Brooks and S. S. Mauney.
