

Cleveland Wildlife Club Seeking More Members

Officials of the Cleveland County Wildlife Club announced this week a current membership of 230 members and urged all sportsmen, hunters, fishermen and farmers to affiliate with the organization.

The Cleveland County group is one of 94 county clubs in the state which is affiliated with the North Carolina Wildlife Federation, Inc., and a large increase in membership is being sought during the month of May, continuing a membership drive begun in April.

There are more than 15,000 members in the state, and the goal is 30,000.

Here in Kings Mountain, 34 sportsmen are now members of Cleveland county club and some members of the local group are hopeful that membership may be increased sufficiently to justify formation of a separate Kings Mountain club.

Full information concerning the organization can be obtained from Joe Lee Woodward, who is a director of the Cleveland county club. Membership fee is \$2.00 per year.

Chief aim of the current Wildlife Club program is a campaign to separate the division of game and inland fisheries from the North Carolina Department of Conservation and Development.

Backers of this proposal contend that funds obtained from the sale of hunting and fishing licenses are not being used for the sole purpose of increasing game and fish and they feel that this should be done.

They favor a separate division, administered by a non-salaried board of representatives from nine districts of the state, with the board members to serve staggered terms. At the present time, five of the 15 members of the Board of Conservation and Development (which also handles state advertising, superintends state parks, etc., are game members, but the Wildlife clubs contend this is not a fair division and that the game members can be outvoted on policy matters.

Candidates for the state legislature are being asked to commit themselves on this issue.

Other officers of the Cleveland county club, in addition to Mr. Woodward, are Dr. Charles Padgett, of Shelby, president, Robert Gidney, secretary-treasurer, and H. H. Gold and Dr. D. F. Moore, directors.

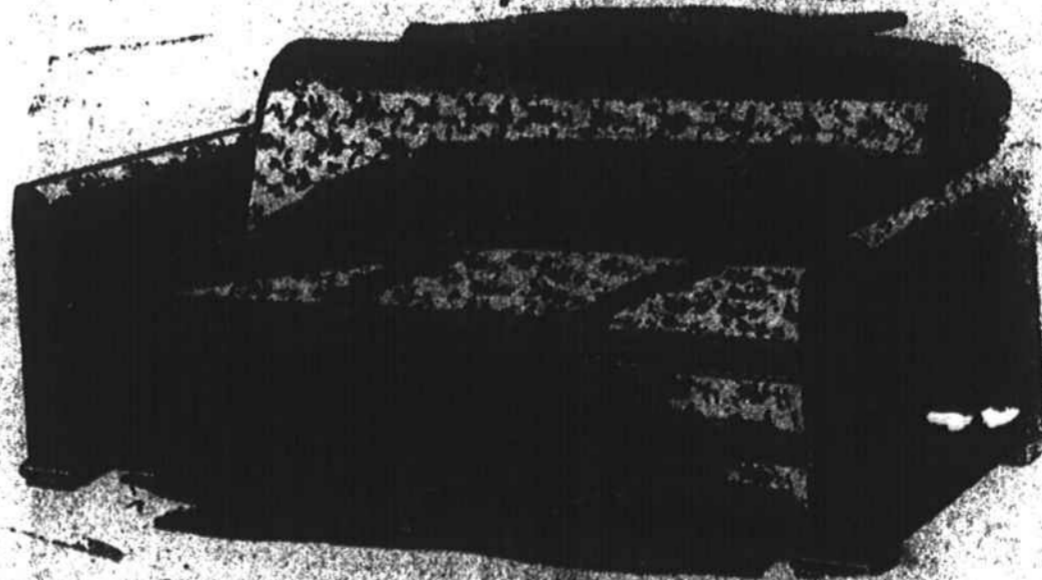
