Announces Changes

NORFOLK. - Two announcements of policy changes in the Marine Au Reserve enlistment program have been made by Major F. J. Frazer, USMC, commanding officer of the Marine Air Detachment at the Naval Air Station, Norfolk.

Formerly only ex-Marines were eligible for service in the Organized Reserve. This policy has been changed in that honorably discharged veterans of all the military services may enlist in the program, providing they are not eligible for selective service. Also the detachment has been authorized to order ex-Leathernecks to serve on active duty with the unit | fions. as "stationkeepers." Station keepers will be enlisted in the Volunteer Marine Corps Reserve with the same rank as at the time of discharge. They will receive full pay and allow auces, and will be eligible for family allowance during the time they serve with the Norfolk detachment. 
