Attempts to Burn Home and Family

Ten-Year-Old Girl Spills Her Father's Crazed Plan.

HIGH POINT, N. C.—Ten-year-old Barbara Ann Deaton broke out some windows and helped her five sisters and brothers to safety when she saw flames curling under the door.

She was able to save Donese, 9; Norma Lee, 8, and Richard, 6, with only minor burns. But 4-year-old Ruby Nadine was so badly burned that doctors at Burri Memorial hospital feared for her life.

Her infant sister, Brenda, perished in the arms of their father, Robert Deaton, 40-year-old High Point painter. In an insane fit of rage Deaton set fire to their home here.

Holding her painfully burned arms away from her side, Barbara Ann told her story.

"Daddy put us to bed. Daddy and mother had been fussing. Daddy got an ax and a pitchfork and said that he was going to kill mother. She ran from the house.

"Daddy was always fussing at mother. He fussed when the food wasn't fixed right. He was always fussing.

"Daddy brought the gasoline into the house. Then he put us to bed in the bedrooms. I knew something was wrong because it was still daylight.

Police reconstructed the rest of the story.

Deaton drenched the front of the house with gasoline and lit it. In a few minutes the house was a roaring place in which he and the baby died.

It was then that Barbara Ann smashed the window and went down to the adjoining room and broke that window, too. She helped her sisters and brothers out.

Almost hysterical, they were standing in the yard when firemen and police arrived. The mother arrived a short time later.

Dr. W. W. Harvey, coroner, listed the case as "obviously homicide and suicide."

Housewife Ends Monkey Business of Peeping Tom

RACINE, WIS.—Zoo officials and police have been plotting for a week, attempting to find a way to capture a "peeping Tom" monkey that escaped from a park and has been worrying householders.

It took a housewife and her 4-year-old son just four minutes to do the job.

Mrs. Charles Zinnin and her son, "Skippy," laid a trail of tidbits to their bathroom window, hoping to entice the monkey which was roosting on their roof. In the bathtub they placed a banana.

They tied a string to the open window screen, leading outside the bathroom door, where Mrs. Zinnin was stationed. "Skippy" was posted at a nearby window to report the monkey's progress to his mother.

In a few minutes the animal entered the bathroom and pounced on the banana. Mrs. Zinnin calmly pulled the string, closing the window screen and trapping the monkey. Then she called Zoo Director George Speidel and told him to come and get his monkey.
