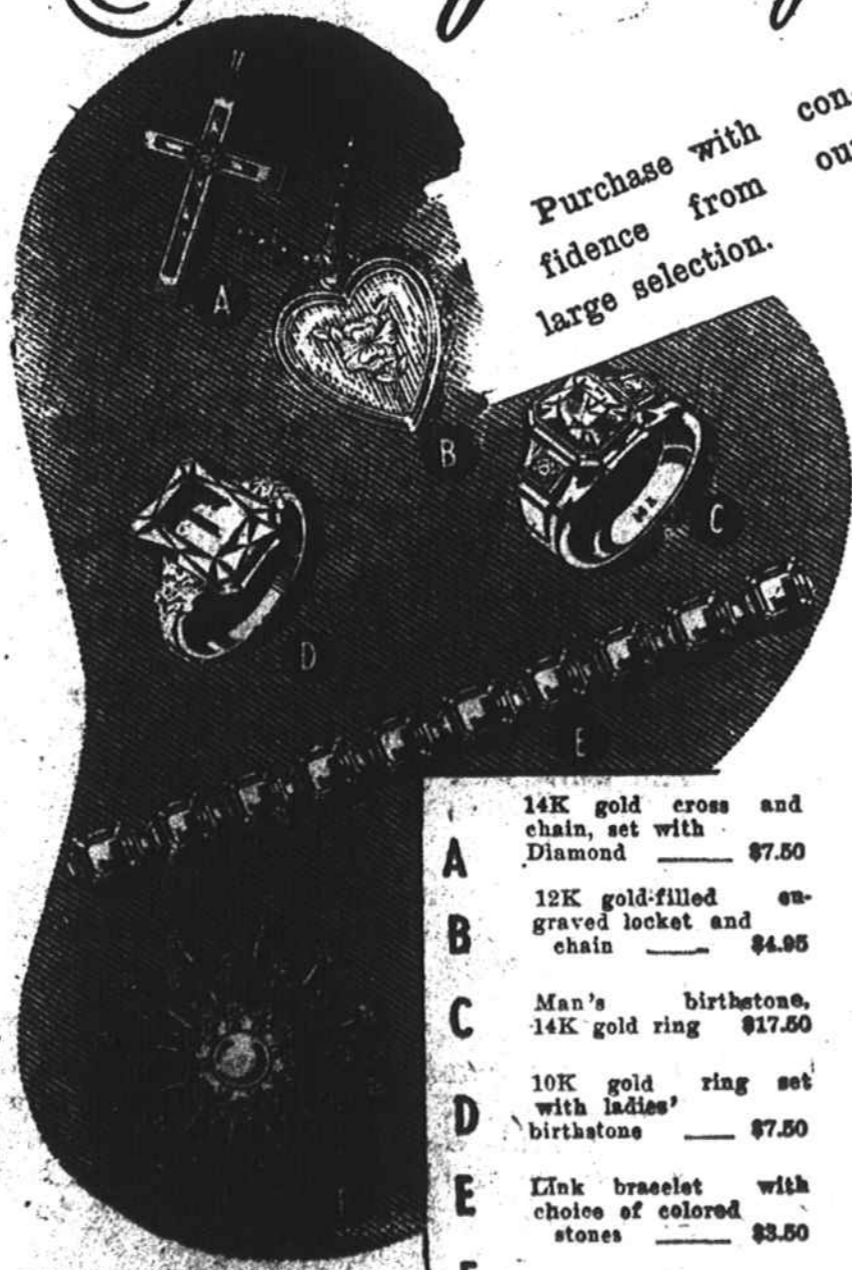
Enlarged Liver
