Resolve To Grow A Good Garden In '47

"A Better Garden in 1947" is a good New Year's resolution to make, regardless of whether one lives on the farm or in an urban district, says John H. Harris, Extension horticultural specialist at State College.

Harris is one of those fellows who not only eats, sleeps, and talks gardening on any and all occasions but also grows a garden in Raleigh of which anyone would be justly proud. Regardless of what time of the year you visit his garden, he always has something growing and he is full of pique of what he intends to plant in the near future.

Not only is the Harris garden an all-year garden but it also combines fruit along with the vegetables. There are finds strawberries, blackberries, Boysenberries, Youngberries, and a number of apple trees that keep the family supplied with fruit throughout the year.

At Christmas the Harris family was eating strawberries, Boysenberries, and peaches from the freezer locker and there were apples stored in a keg covered with soil in the garden and still other apples wrapped and stored in the garage.

In the garden there were turnips, mustard, kale, and collards. Usually at this time of the year the Harris family also has some parsnips but this season they are missing. Not so long ago there were fall squash.

Along with the New Year's resolution for a better garden in 1947, Harris suggests that each member of the family be encouraged to draw up a garden plan in keeping with his own ideas. A prize might be given to the youngster who plans the best garden with the widest variety of vegetables based upon the likes and dislikes of the family. It's a good time to plan for some new vegetables that have not been grown before.
