Under the election notice for school trustees, which is appearing in legal advertisement form this week, prospective candidates must file notice of candidacy with the city clerk not later than five days prior to May 6 and pay a \$5.00 filing fee.

Registration books will open on Saturday April 12 and be open each Saturday through May 3. The voting place will be City Hall, and the voting officials appointed are: C. L. Black, registrar, Howard Jenkins and C. E. Warlick.

Candidates for the election for mayor and city commissioners, called for May 13, must file by May 9, also in writing, and pay the \$5.00 fee to City Clerk Karl Sawyer. Registration books will be open April 19.
