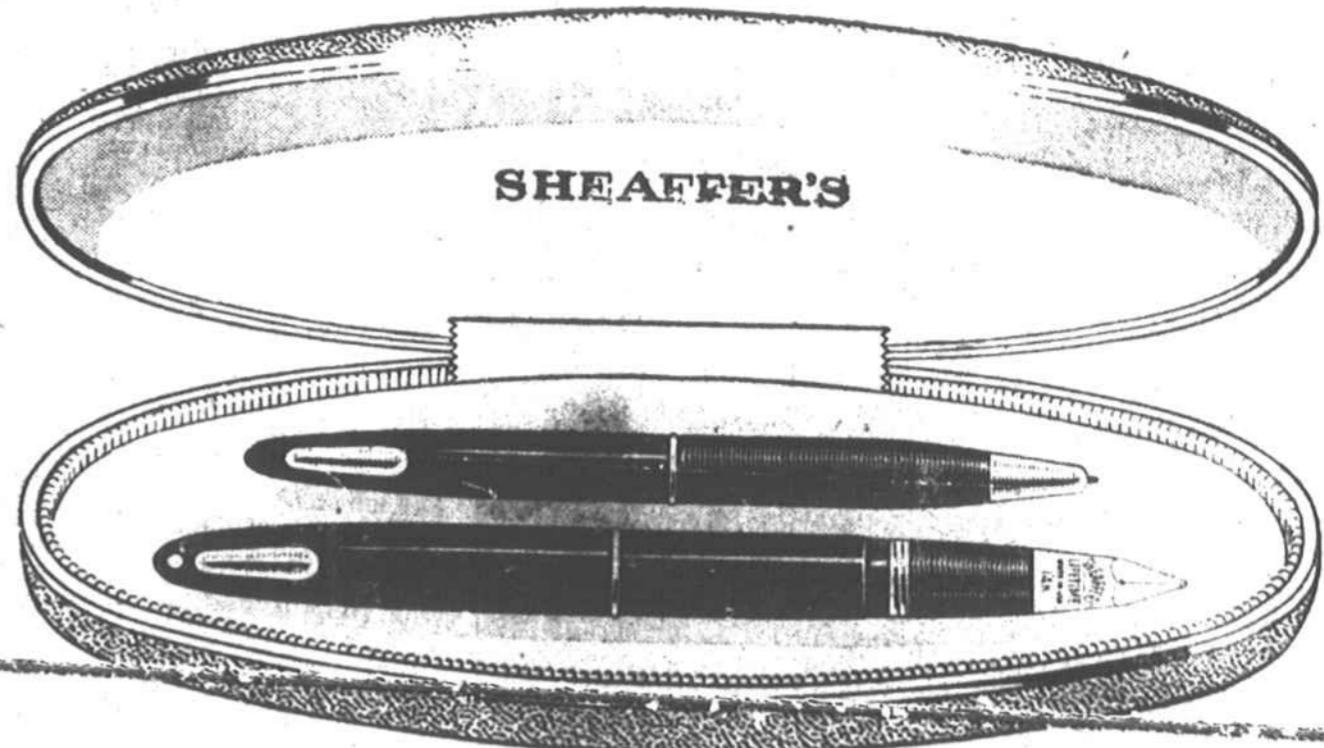
**Middleton Speaker On Baptist Hour**
