Bone Development

At birth, a human skull comprises many bones which are distinctly separe ed. Some of the bones, such as those on the top and sides of the skull, have saw-like edges (su-tures) which gradually grow together. At the age of 50 years, all trace of the sutures has usually disappeared and the dome of the skull looks like one bone. The ends of the long bones of arms and legs show a distinct division from the shafts in infancy, but generally these divisions have disappeared before the age of 25 years. Teeth are often a reliable guide to age because there is a regular order of appearance. The first to appear are the juvenile (milk) teeth. These are replaced in regular sequence by the adult (permanent) teeth. The third molars (wisdom teeth) usually erupt at the age of 18 to 21 years, sometimes the age of 18 to 21 years, sometimes rather later. With advancing age the angle of the jaw grows wider. Teeth fall out and the margin of the law becomes a thin, bony edge.
