RALEIGH. — W. H. Darst, director of the North Carolina Department of Agriculture Seed Laboratory, was re-elected as president of the Association of Seed Control Officials of the Southeastern States.
Park A. Yeats, director of the Oklahoma seed division, was elected vice president, and L. N. Allan, of the Federal Seed Act district office in Alabama, was re-elected secretary.
Election of officers ended a two-day session in Raleigh. Seed-control officials from 11 Southern states attended.
State Agriculture Commissioner W. Kerr Scott and Assistant Commissioner D. S. Coltrane participated in the sessions.
