

New Officials Take Agricultural Prizes

Raleigh, Dec. 8.—Two new officials have reported for work with the State Department of Agriculture. They are Cecil D. Thomas, who became executive assistant superintendent of the Test Farms Division, and J. M. Carr, who became assistant director in charge of the Tobacco Branch Experiment Station at Oxford.

Thomas, 35 year old native of Rockingham county, took over a newly created post to work with Fred E. Miller, superintendent of the Test Farms Division, in managing the nine test farms operated by the department. He was educated at Leaksville high school, N. C. State College and Virginia Tech. He came to his new job from the Richmond, Va., Federal Reserve Bank, where he was agricultural representative in the Bank Relations Department. Previously, he had worked with the North Carolina and Virginia agricultural extension services.

Carr, recognized as an outstanding authority on flue-cured tobacco production, succeeded E. G. Moss, who has retired. Moss started the tobacco research work at Oxford in 1912 and headed the station continuously until his retirement.

For the past 20 years Carr headed research work for the U. S. Department of Agriculture at the Coastal Plain Experiment Station at Tifton, Ga. He is a native of Halifax county Virginia, and once worked with the Virginia Agricultural Extension Service. He was educated at Virginia Tech.

Basic Training Not Required For Veterans

Raleigh, Dec. 8.—In accordance with a new directive from Headquarters Marine Corps, Captain Roy I. Wood, Jr., Officer in Charge of Marine Recruiting in North Carolina, announced today, that men enlisting in the Marine Corps, who have had at least one year previous service in the Army, Navy, or Coast Guard will not be required to take the ten weeks of basic training that is usual given all Marine recruits.

Men who served with a special branch, such as Medical Department, etc., will be transferred to Marine Barracks, Quantico, Va., for duty with the 22nd Marines (Reinforced). Other veterans may select a station of duty east of the Mississippi, some of which are: Marine Barracks, Quantico, Va., Naval Base, Philadelphia, Pa., Naval Gun Factory, Washington, D. C., Marine Barracks, Camp Lejeune, N. C., Marine

Barracks, Norfolk Naval Shipyard, Portsmouth, Va., and Marine Barracks, U. S. Naval Base, Charleston, S. C.

This is the latest change in Marine Corps policies, with regards to accepting men for enlistment in the regular Marine Corps who have prior service in other military organizations.

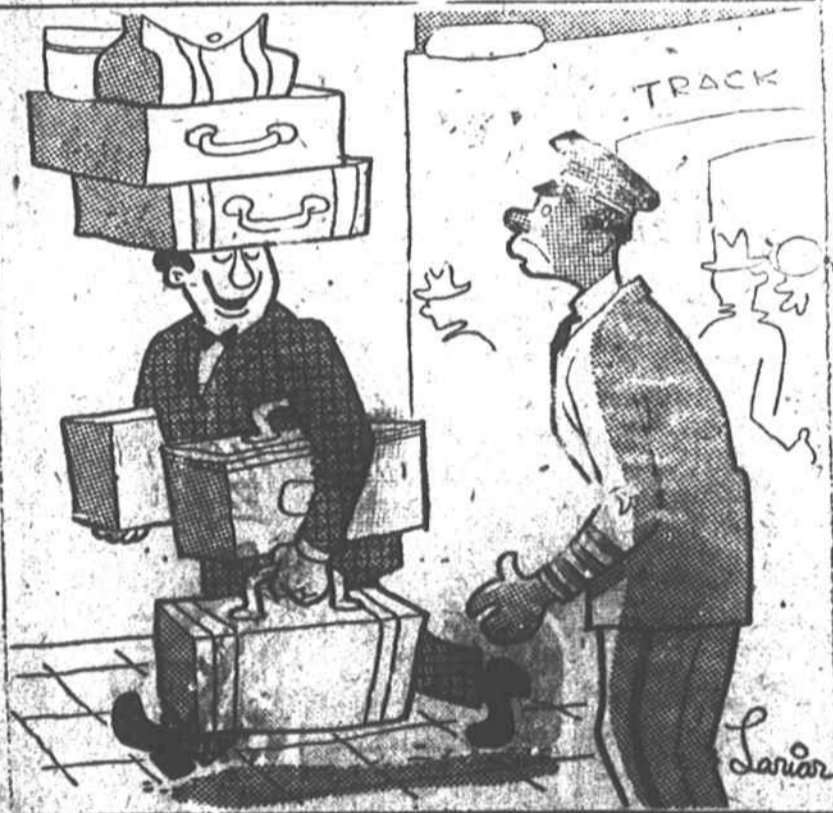
