7:30—The Senior Woman's Club will meet at the club house. Mrs. N. F. McGill will conduct a program on Contemporary American Music.

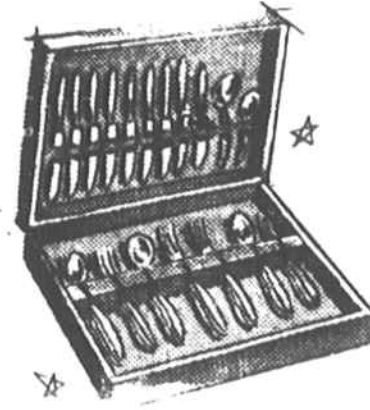
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
