Mitchem-Huffstetler Wedding at Macedonia

A wedding of beauty and dignity took place at Macedonia Baptist church Friday evening, Dec. 12, when Miss Frances Lucile Huffstetler, only daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Dan S. Huffstetler, became the bride of William Pressley Mitchem, son of Mr. and Mrs. John Mitchem, Rev. C. B. Bobbitt, pastor of the church, and Rev. W. H. Stender, pastor of St. Matthew's Lutheran church, joined in performing the beautiful double ring ceremony.

The altar, sheathed in white, was decorated with fern, tall baskets filled with white gladioli and numerous white candelabra holding burning cathedral tapers, which furnished the light for the service. Mrs. C. E. Warlick, pianist, and B. S. Peeler, jr., vocalist, presented a program of nuptial music. Prior to the ceremony Mrs. Warlick played "Moonlight Sonata" by Beethoven and "Traumerel" by Shumann. Mr. Peeler's numbers were "At Dawning" by Cadman, "Because" by d'Hardelet and "Perfect Love" by Barnby. The "Bridal Chorus" from Lohengrin by Wagner was used as the processional and Mendelssohn's "Wedding March" from "A Midsummer Night's Dream" as the recessional.

Miss Huffstetler was escorted to the altar by her father, who gave her in marriage. An attractive blonde, she was lovely in her wedding gown of ivory satin which was styled with a lace yoke in a fitted bodice, long sleeves featuring tiny buttons at the wide molded cuff, and full skirt extending into a short train. Her full length veil of illusion was secured with a bandeau of dainty white flowers. She carried a nosegay of white carnations centered with an orchid and caught with white maline.

Mrs. Charles Alexander was her cousin's matron of honor. She wore

a gown of pale blue taffeta and marquisette, patterned similar to that of the bride. Her nosegay was pink, white and blue carnations tied with pink streamers and her hair adornment was a circlet of small blue flowers. Misses Audrey Timms and Betty Wells, as bridesmaids, wore identical dresses of pale pink. They carried old fashioned nosegays and wore headresses of pink carnations.
