Farm operating costs in 1948 are likely to continue their rise even from the present record high levels. In 1947 these costs totaled 14.9 billion dollars, compared with 12.8 billion in 1946 and an average of 5.2 billion in 1935-39. Since 1939 farmers operating expenses have risen from 9 to 25 percent a year.

Results of experiments in chemical drying of seed grain, using calcium chloride as the drying agent, conducted this year justify further investigations of this method, according to the USDA.

Dairy cows have 98 percent single births, beef cattle 99.5 per cent. Most of the rest are twins. Triplet births occur at the rate of 1 in 300 with dairy cows, or about one-third of 1 per cent.
