## Senior Club Women To Meet Next Week

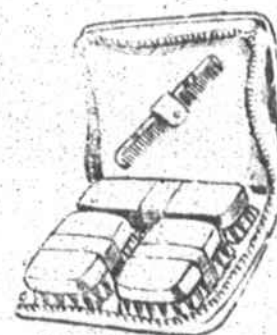
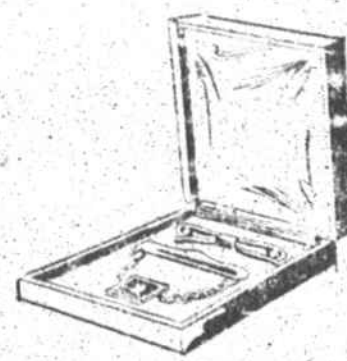
