Advancements, including merit badges, among Kings Mountain districts Boy Scouts, jumped from 212 in 1942 to a total of 626 in 1947 according to information published in the program of the annual banquet held Jan. 10. Rev. J. W. Phillips, pastor of First Wesleyan Methodist church, was elected to succeed W. L. Plonk as chairman of the district.

In 1943 advancements jumped to 452 and declined by 1944 to a total of 242. In 1945 the total rose to 387 and in 1946 to 406.

Financial report made by Paul Mauney, retiring chairman of the finance committee, showed a balance of \$2,122.50, of which more than two-thirds, or \$1,847.74 will go to Carl Davidson Memorial Fund.

Navy research and invention was focussed heavily on increased power in the air during 1947. New planes added to the Navy's air arm include the Phantom, the Skystreak, Pirate, Banshee, Panther and Skyrocket. Navy pilots set and reestablished two world speed records. A carrier-based jet fighter squadron was formed. The Navy's progress in the air included also guided missile study, advances in radar, new parachutes for high-speed bail-outs, new self-sealing gas tanks, and higher octane fuel.
