At the same time it was announced that Jack Phillips, a Navy Veteran of Route 5, Shelby, had re-enlisted in the Navy as a Seaman First Class.

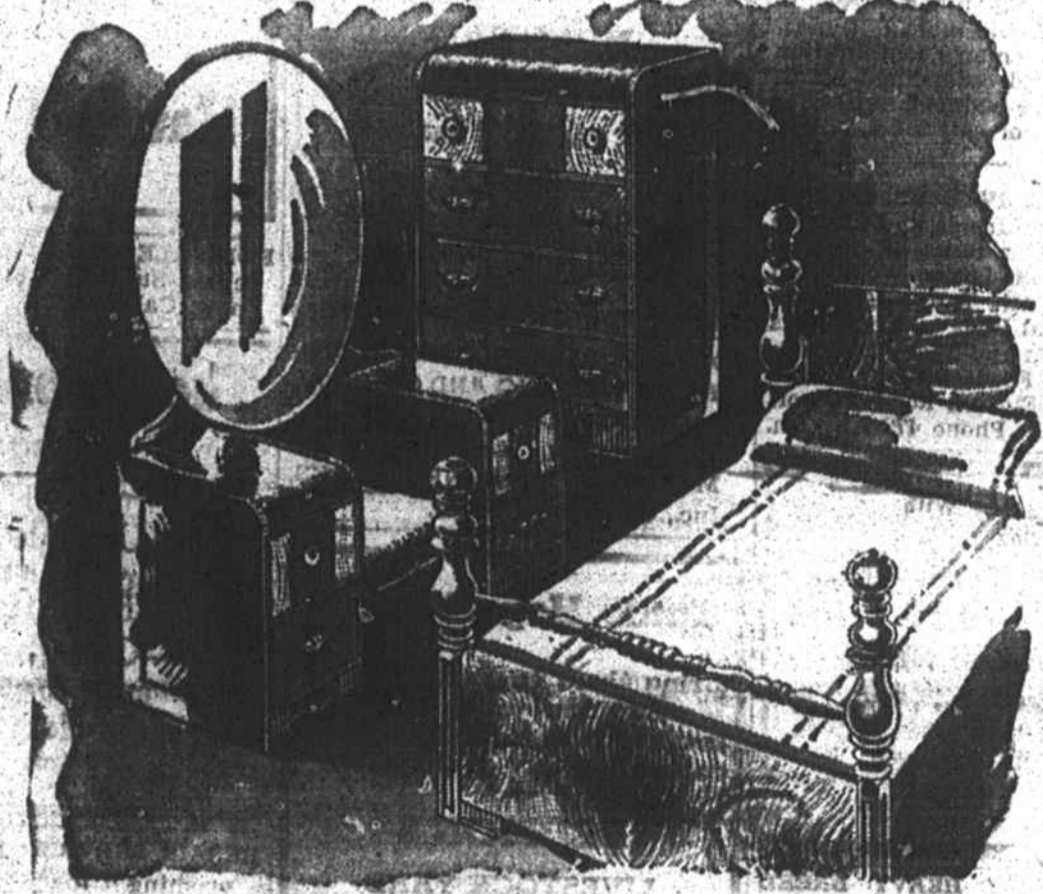

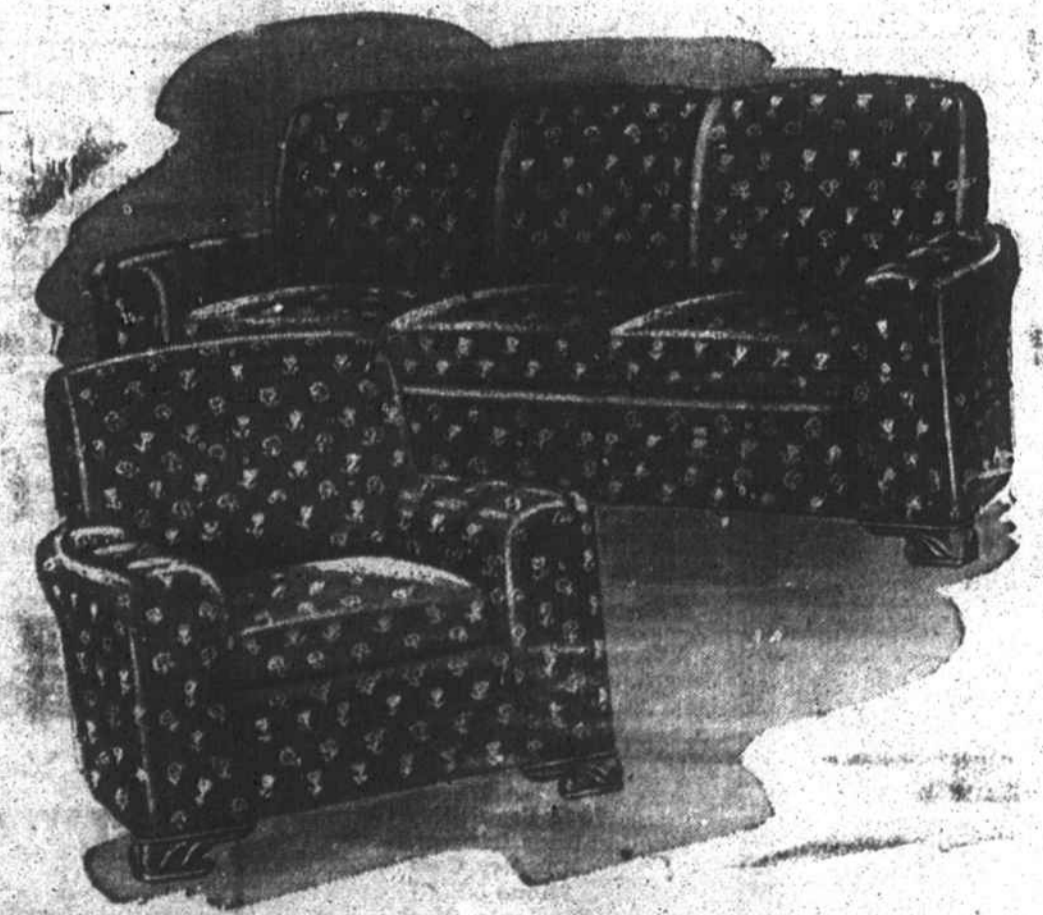
