**Esso Production
Shows Increase**

Refineries of Esso Standard Oil Company have continued to emphasize the output of much-needed heating oil and kerosene, turning out more than 14 million gallons more of these products in February than in the previous month, M. J. Rathbone, President, reported today.

In addition, the company contributed approximately three and a half million gallons of kerosene and heating oil last month to state and city emergency fuel coordinators for allocation to relieve hardship cases in various cities in the area where Esso operates. This brings the Company's total contribution for such purposes to almost nine-million gallons since the first of the year.

The increased production, Mr. Rathbone said, reflected the improved tanker transportation situation during the month and the continued adjustment of refinery yields to maximize kerosene and heating oil at the Company's refineries in Linden and Bayonne, New Jersey, Baltimore, Md., Baton Rouge, La, Everett, Mass., and Charleston, S. C.

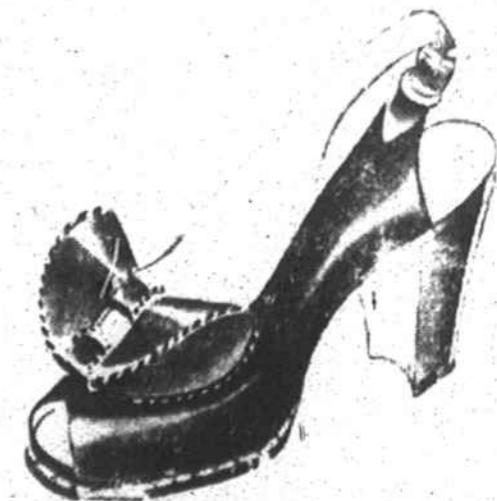
