Enlisted Ex-GI'S Now Offered Commissions

In order to build up the reserve components of the United States Army, qualified former servicemen with at least a year's prior service in the Army, Navy, Coast Guard or Marines are being offered direct commissions as Second Lieutenants in the Officers' Reserve Corps with the guarantee of two years immediate active duty with the Regular Army.

M-Sgt. R. V. Kennedy, commanding officer of the Shelby Army and Air Force Recruiting Station states, these commissions will be given in many branches of service including the Infantry, Field Artillery, Cavalry or anti-aircraft and Guided Missiles. He also announced that applications for these commissions will be processed through the local recruiting station.

Qualifications requirements for application for Second Lieutenant's commission in the Reserve are as follows: male citizen of the United States, between the ages of 19 and 31 years, inclusive, one year of previous military service in one of the armed forces, physically fit, two years of college training, a score of 110 or higher on the Army General Classification test, and willingness to accept active duty for not less than two years at the time of commissioning.

Sergeant Kennedy said the Army does not desire to interrupt any young man's education, so will not grant a commission to any man currently attending college or who is due to be attending college at the time of his commissioning.

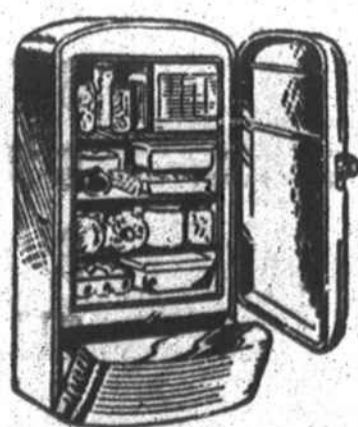
