**Wildlife Commission Plans Quail Transplanting Project**—North Carolina sportsmen and wildlife clubs will be given an opportunity to participate in a quail transplanting project according to Clyde P. Patton, Executive Director of the North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission. At a recent meeting in Raleigh the North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission authorized Director Patton to issue permits to sportsmen and sportsmen's organizations to trap quail within city limits and other areas not open to hunting, to be transplanted in areas where there is suitable environment to support quail. "Such environment," Patton said, "should include adequate protective and nesting cover and a year round food supply."

Sportsmen wishing to participate in this program should write directly to the Director, Wildlife Commission in Raleigh. When the Director has made an investigation of the situation and determined that such a trapping and transplanting plan would be feasible, he will issue a permit to the sportsmen or organizations desiring to participate.

The purpose of the program is to utilize quail populations in non-hunted areas for providing a seed

stock and establishing a huntable surplus in areas where mismanagement has depleted the former supply. Patton pointed out that wild quail grow under natural conditions are superior to pen-reared quail for stocking purposes. Permits will be granted only to reputable conservationists.

**Wildlife Commission Appoints Two New District Law Enforcement Supervisors**—Two new District Law Enforcement Supervisors have been appointed on the North Carolina Wildlife Commission's law enforcement staff, according to Executive Director Clyde P. Patton. Homer L. Biggers, Morganton, has been replaced in his position as Supervisor of District Eight, and has been assigned a position as District Protector in Burke County. R. F. Wade, formerly District Protector of Vance County has been appointed Supervisor of District Eight to succeed Biggers.

In District Seven, Robert F. Logan chose to retire from his position as District Supervisor in favor of a position as District Protector in Orange County which was offered him. Logan is succeeded by Walter F. Edmiston, Boone, former District Protector of Watauga County.

**Several Openings Remain For Organized Hunts**—There are still several hundred opening available in North Carolina's organized deer and bear hunts in the mountain areas of the state, according to Clyde P. Patton, Executive Director of the North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission. Two hundred vacancies exist in the Sherwood Forest deer and bear hunt in Haywood County. One hundred applications will be honored for each of two periods with 100 hunters per period. The first three-day opening will be on November 29 and 30 and December 1 in the west fork of the Pigeon River section. The second period will be on December 2, 3, and 4 in the east fork of the Pigeon River section.

There are ninety openings in the Fires Creek deer hunt in Clay County, with half of the applications to be allotted during the period of November 18, 19, and 20, and the other half on November 25, 26, and 27.

There are 80 openings in the Standing Indian Wildlife Area in Macon County for deer hunting only. These openings will be divided into three periods, November 18, 19, and 20; November 25, 26, and 27; December 2, 3, and 4. Applications will be honored as soon as received by the North Carolina Wildlife Resources Commission in Raleigh. Applications must be received, processed, and the permit granted 5 days before the dates of the scheduled hunts.

### Check With Atlanta For Overseas Mailing

Residents of Cleveland county who plan to send gift packages to foreign countries this Christmas should get in touch with the United States Department of Commerce in Atlanta and obtain information regarding regulations regarding such shipments, according to advices received here from C. Parker Persons, Commerce Department regional director in Atlanta.

Almost every country has some kind of regulation covering the receiving and handling of gift packages in those countries, and there is a wide variation in many of the regulations, Mr. Persons said. Consequently, if such packages are not wrapped in accordance with the regulations, if certain duties are not paid, if certain weights are not followed, and the like, the sender may find the package coming back, or was stated.

Many countries do not permit the

importation of certain goods, and the sender should know what may or may not be sent to specific countries, Mr. Persons explained. Also, there may be a limitation as to the number of given articles which may be included in the one package, he added.

"My advice to those planning to send gifts to other countries is to learn what the regulations are before sending them, and they can get up-to-date information on the subject by communicating with our Atlanta office, the address of which is Post Office Box 1595, Atlanta, 1, Georgia," he stated. "Our Atlanta office is located at 418 Atlanta National Building, 50 Whitehall St., and we will be glad to receive a personal call from anyone interested."
