

### Juniors Grab Win In Opening Game

Kings Mountain junior baseball team opened group 2, area 4 Legion play here before some 500 fans Monday night defeating Taylorsville juniors in a loose game 14 to 7.

Capt. Moss started for Kings Mountain, went out in the bottom of the sixth for a pinch-hitter lagging by three runs. His teammates rallied for 4 runs in the sixth, Moss taking credit for the victory as he was leading 8-7 when Max Bohn took over with a hit.

Bohn whiffed five and set the visitors down without a hit in the final game frames.

Kings Mountain opened the bottom of the first two runs down, scored a pair to tie the game and came in strong in the third for another pair to take a lead they held until the fifth.

Taylorsville knotted the count in the fifth with a pair and scored three runs in the sixth before the locals staged the 4-run sixth inning rally.

Jim Kimmell, hustling second baseman, had three hits in five trips and the Kings Mountain hitters, Kimmell and First Baseman Robert Bridges sparked the defensive play of the locals.

Jim St. Clair, visiting left fielder, went a perfect three for three at the plate, drawing a pair of walks.

### Juniors Defeat Forest City 12-9

Kings Mountain junior baseball team notched victory number two here in City Stadium Tuesday night combining heads-up base running with four hits, a dozen free passes, two hit batsmen, a gift to first base via catchers interference, two sacrifice hits and six enemy errors to down Forest City juniors by a score of 12 to 9.

Kings Mountain base-runners pilfered six sacks and batters left 11 men on bases.

Keystones Jim Kimmell slapped a triple in the fifth with two mates aboard for Kings Mountain's big blow. Kimmell scored in Jim Cobb's single.

Forest City scored single runs in the third and fourth to take a short lead and rain threatened the game. Coach Shu Carlton's nine came back strong in the bottom half of the fourth to score five runs on no hits, six walks, catchers interference, two wild pitches, a hit batsman, a balk and a sacrifice hit.

Kings Mountain scored a single in the sixth as Carol Ledford, left-fielder, stole home after taking first on an error and advancing to third on an error by the catcher.

The locals wrapped up the game in the seventh with three runs.

Howard (Sonny) White, Bessemer City righthander, got credit for the win with able assistance from Gus Hartsoe, Jr., who came to the hill in the seventh and set the Forest City boys down with three hits, three runs and five strike outs.
