French Pianist At Winthrop Monday Night

ROCK HILL—A French pianist whose playing has been called "the most beautiful of the century" will give his first Winthrop college concert, Monday (March 13) at 8 p. m. in the auditorium.
 He is Robert Casadesus, composer-pianist, and the ninth of 10 artists presented on Winthrop's 1949-50 concert series. Casadesus, born to a notably musical family, studied at the conservatory of his native Paris, graduating with all prizes. He made his American debut with the New York Philharmonic.

Symphony orchestra in 1935, and since that time has appeared with the Philharmonic every season as guest soloist.
 Casadesus makes his winter home at Princeton, N. J. His pianist wife, Gaby, appears with him often in joint recitals. His son, Jean, has embarked on his own pianistic career.
 At his Winthrop concert, Casadesus will play three etudes of his own composition, the Beethoven "Sonata, Op. 57 (Appassionata)", "Forest Scenes" by Schumann, and other selections of Bach, Rameau, Faure, and Chopin.
