

State Scholarships Available For Children Of War I, II Vets

Full four-year college scholarships, including "Fee" tuition, room, board, and all necessary fees required by the State owned educational institutions at which such student has matriculated, are made available by the State of North Carolina to certain eligible children of war veterans. The scholarships are for use during the regular school years and do not include summer schools. Scholarships are available only in State owned and operated educational institutions.

There are three main classes of scholarships offered:

A. Unlimited Number. For children of war veterans killed in war-time service, or who died as a direct result of wartime service connected wounds or disabilities, even though death may have occurred after discharge, or separation from service.

B. Limited to Ten Each Year. Children of veterans having service-connected wartime disability of 30 percent or more as rated by U. S. Veterans Administration. Veterans must have been legal resident of North Carolina upon entrance into service.

C. Limited to Fifteen Each Year. Children of veterans rated as 100-percent disabled and drawing compensation therefor. If veteran is deceased, he must have had the rating prior to death. Rating could be for service connected or non-service connected disability or disabilities. Veteran must have been a legal resident of North Carolina upon entry into service.

Two years residence in State of North Carolina, high school graduate, and less than 21 years of age are required of all applicants to be eligible. Marriage of applicant before or after applying does not disqualify for scholarship. Adopted or stepchildren do not qualify.

Applications should be filed in duplicate accompanied by the certified copy of child's birth certificate with: Director, N. C. Veterans, P. O. Box 2187, Raleigh, N. C., before July of each year, the month the awards are made.

If a child of a veteran has applied for scholarship before this year, but failed to obtain one due to limited supply, he or she may apply again, even though it has been a year or so since graduation and may have already entered college.

Live At Home

There are many insects that do a tremendous amount of damage to the gardens each year. Three of the most common are the bean beetles, potato beetles, and aphids.

The adult Mexican bean beetle is a copper colored beetle having 16 black spots. The larvae, or "grubs," are fuzzy, lemon to orange colored. Both the adult and the larvae feed on the underside of the leaves of snap and lima beans, causing them to appear "lace-like." When present in large numbers, they also eat the pods and stems. There are usually 3 to 4 generations a year, requiring about 30 days from the egg to the adult stage. These can be controlled by dusting with Rotenone or Cryolite. Care should be taken to get this on the under-

side of the leaf, and several applications may be needed through the season. After the beans quit bearing, the vines should be destroyed.

Aphids, or plant lice, do more damage than the average gardener thinks. These are small, soft bodied insects, ranging from a greenish, reddish, to brown or black in color, which cluster on the bottom sides of larvae and on growing tips of most all crops at one time or another. Parasites and predators, especially the lady beetles, often keep the lice under control. Nootine, D. D. T., and Rotenone usually give satisfactory control. Both the adult and the brick-red larvae of the potato beetle feed on the larvae and terminal growth of potatoes. Often these same beetles feed on tomatoes, egg plants, peppers, cabbage and a few other plants.

The adults deposit small yellow to orange colored eggs in batches on the underside of the leaves. The larvae, when full grown, go into the soil to pupate. Both calcium arsenate and DDT.
