Twenty eight members of the class with their families enjoyed the happy get-together. Invocation was given by Mr. B. N. Barnes.

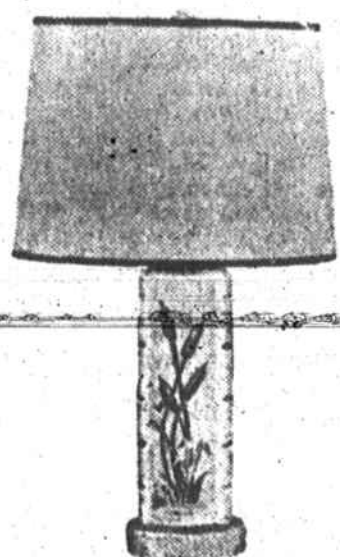

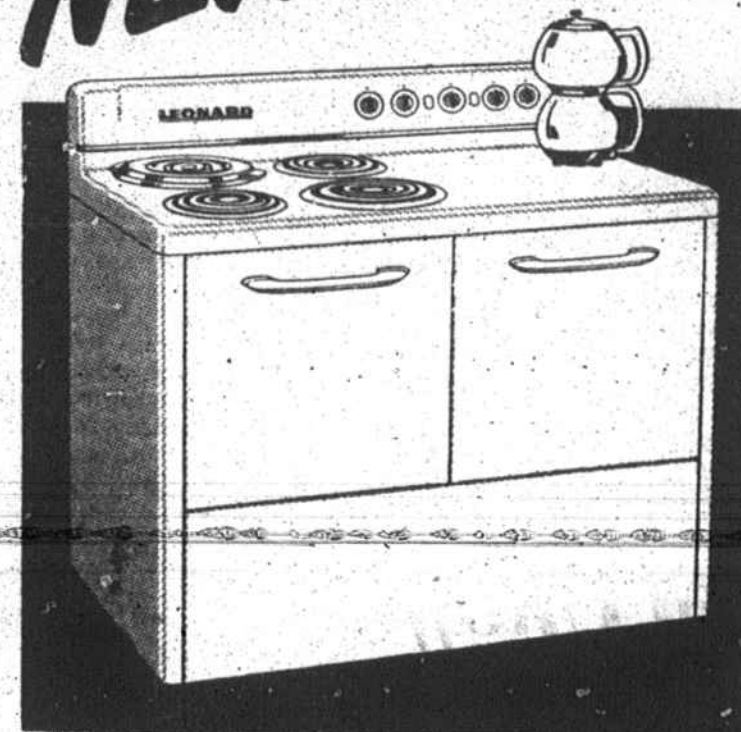
