
Never put off until tomorrow what you can do today! Yes, if you wonder whether

your'e entitled to Social Security benefits, inquire today. It may cost you another month's benefits if you wait until tomorrow. Remember, benefits are paid at age 65 and to survivors of deceased wage earners. Payments, whether retirement

or survivor's monthly or lumpsum, are not made automatically. A claim for benefits must be filed before payment can be made. It is important to file a claim promptly; otherwise, benefits may be lost. Thus, if a claim is not filed until the fourth month after the month of the insured's person's death or attainment of age 65, one month's payment is lost.
