

# Mountaineers At Home To Stanley Blue Devils Friday Night At 7:30

Kings Mountain high school's Mountaineers are scheduled to face the Stanley high school "Blue Devils" in the third game of the 1950 gridiron season at City Stadium here Friday night. Game time is 7:30 p. m.

The Stanley eleven, coached by Dick Thompson, sports a perfect season to date — untied, undefeated and un-scored-on.

The Gaston County "Little Eight" conference "Blue Devils" have posted two wins, both by 6 to 0 scores, over Bessemer City and Cramerton.

L. D. Abernathy, senior with three years experience on the Stanley squad, plays both at tackle and in the backfield. He scored the winning marker against Cramerton last Friday afternoon on an eight yard plunge.

Coach Thompson has a veteran squad with five starters listed as on the squad for their third year. They are Captain Riley Skidmore, guard, Co-Captain Ralph Smith, back, Abernathy, Joe Saunders, back, and Don Mauney, center.

Four other starters — Sidney Brandon, end, Lewis Armstrong, back, Don Hester, guard, and Charles Stephenson, back — have been on the squad two years.

The "Blue Devils" roster also

lists 11 other players with experience on the squad.

Coach Shu Carlton will have to send the Mountaineers into the game without the services of Tackle Gerald Valentine, stellar sophomore defensive man. Valentine cut his foot on a broken bottle near Central gymnasium this week and will definitely miss the battle. Doctors are to remove the stitches next Wednesday and he will probably see only defensive duty, if any, against Cherryville on September 29th.

The Mountaineers came out of the rugged Charlotte Tech game last Friday on the short end of a 14 to 0 count but with no bad injuries reported. Several of the Kings Mountain players were shaken up but the squad is reported in good condition for the Stanley game Friday night.

Friday night's game is a non-conference affair. The first Western (Class A) conference game of the 1950 season is scheduled for City Stadium on September 29 when Kings Mountain will mark the annual homecoming celebration with a game against Cherryville high's "Ironmen."
