You and Social Security

A dependant husband, as well as a dependant wife, is eligible to old-age and survivors insurance payments under the amended social security law.

Beginning this September, the dependant husband of a woman who, through her own work in a social security job became entitled to old-age benefit payments at any time after 1939, is also entitled to insurance payments.

This gives to the dependant husband the same old-age and survivors benefits that the dependant wife has always had under social security. To qualify as a dependant husband, he must have the status of husband of an insured woman worker under State law and be the father of her son or daughter, or have been married to her for not less than three years immediate preceding the day on which the application was filed.

The dependant husband must be 65, or over, be living with the woman worker at the time he fills the application for insurance payments, and have been receiving at least one-third of his support from the woman worker at the time she became entitled to old-age insurance benefits. The dependant husband's insurance benefit payments will be one-half the amount payable to the insured woman worker on whom

Garber To Speak To Methodists

Bishop Paul N. Garber of Geneva, Switzerland, will be the principal speaker at the "Advance" or Missionary rallies for the Gastonia District of the Methodist Church. These rallies will be held on Sunday, November 19th, at 2:30 p. m., at Dallas, and at 7:30 p. m., at the Central Methodist Church, Shelby. Bishop Garber will preach at 11:00 o'clock the morning of the 19th at Main Street Methodist Church, Gastonia.

Brief addresses will be given in the rallies by Mrs. Hillard R. Harrelson, District President, and Mrs. J. W. Payne, Conference President, of the Woman's Society of Christian Service, Rev. L. R. Spencer, District Missionary Secretary, and Rev. J. W. Fowler, Jr., Representative of the Conference Board of Missions and Church Extension. Dr. W. A. Stanbury, Superintendent of the Gastonia District, will preside at these meetings.

Bishop Garber, before his election to the Episcopacy in 1944, was Dean of the Duke University Divinity School. The Bishop was assigned to the Geneva Area of The Methodist Church immediately after his election. He entered this field early in 1945, and has lived within that territory since that date, supervising the work of The Methodist Church in Central and Southern Europe, and in North Africa. Bishop Garber has a personal and intimate knowledge of the situation and needs in that part of the world and will speak out of this rich background.

Similar rallies will be held in all the districts of the Western North Carolina Conference and the meetings are all open to the general public.
