

Hawks Down Mountaineers In Home Finale

Mt. Holly High Posts 13 To 6 Loop Victory

Kings Mountain pushed over a quick touchdown early in the game at City Stadium last Friday night but was unable to hold the hard-charging Mt. Holly forward wall the rest of the way and bowed 13 to 6 in a Western (AA) conference game.

Jim Kimmell, Mountaineer tail back, triple-threat, busted over right tackle on the fifth play of the game, cut back to his left and scooted 42 yards for Kings Mountain's only score. Guard Robert Davis' placement try for point was wide to the left.

Kings Mountain recovered a Mt. Holly fumble on the first scrimmage play of the game to set up the score.

A blocked punt and an intercepted pass set up the two scores for the Hawks of Mt. Holly high.

one near the end of the first period and the winning tally midway in the final quarter.

Play-by-Play

Davis kicked to the MH 25 to Fullback Ted Waldrop who returned 9 and added one on the first line play but fumbled. Kings Mountain recovering on the MH 35.

Kimmell passed to Wingback Billy Shytle incomplete on the 20. Fullback Don Bumgardner picked up 4 but KM drew five yards for backfield in motion. Kimmell ran 42 yards for a touchdown.

Davis kicked but MH was offside and drew five yards. Guard Paul McGinnis kicked to the MH 36 and End Chuck Black returned 8. Tailback Andy Carpenter tossed a long, high pass that End Dickie Carpenter hauled in on the KM 30, good for 34 yards and a 1st down. Tackle Johnny Wike was thrown out of the game and MH penalized 15 yards for unsportsmanlike conduct. Kimmell intercepted Carpenter's pass on the 24 and ran it back five yards. Bumgardner picked up 8, Shytle recovered his fumble for minus 7. Kimmell passed incomplete to blocking back Jim Cobb and

Kimmell punted short out-of-bounds on the MH 44, when rushed hard.

Wingback Bennett Kistler lost one, A. Carpenter was stopped by Cobb after 3 and T. Waldrop's pass fell incomplete. A. Carpenter punted to the KM 10 to Shytle who returned 8.

Kimmell was stopped, Bumgardner added 2 and Kimmell's quick kick was blocked by Guard Ronnie Estridge. Tackle Robert Lee recovering on the KM 5.

Kistler ran over for the first score on a reverse. Guard Dickie McMackin downed A. Carpenter after a bad center pass on the try for point.

Bumgardner returned Tackle Joe Huffstetler's kickoff 16 yards as the quarter ended. Kimmell gained a yard and passed incomplete to End Fred Tate. Bumgardner added 4 and Kimmell's punt was blocked by D. Carpenter, Kimmell recovering on the KM 18 with the ball going over.

End Don Flowers stopped T. Waldrop for no gain, McGinnis downed Wingback Lonnie Norwood after a yard. T. Waldrop's pass fell incomplete. A. Carpenter was stopped after four yards but KM was penalized 5 yards from the KM 11 where a holding penalty was called, giving the Hawks a 1st down on the KM 6.

A. Carpenter was stopped and the Hawks drew 15 yards for holding on the next play. Shytle broke up A. Carpenter's pass to Black. A. Carpenter's pass to Norwood was good for 11 yards but he threw over the end zone on the fourth down pass and the ball went over on the 12.

Bumgardner's 4 was cancelled as KM drew 5 for offside. Kimmell's pass to Shytle netted a yard, Kimmell picked up 2 and quick kicked 30 yards to the KM 40 to A. Carpenter who returned 6.

T. Waldrop picked up 3. A. Carpenter lost one as Tackle Charles Mauney came in to down him and T. Waldrop's pass was incomplete. A. Carpenter punted into the end zone.

Bumgardner picked up 3, Kimmell's pass to Shytle fell incomplete on the 50 and Kimmell failed to gain as the half ended.

Second Half

Huffstetler kicked off to the KM 12, Kimmell returning 27 yards. Fullback Walter Griffin picked up two and Kimmell five but Shytle was stopped for a loss of three, penalty KM offside refused. McGinnis' punt was partially blocked and was downed

Flowers ran Huffstetler's kickoff back 5 yards to the KM 42. Kimmell threw a strike to End Johnny Kiser, who was in the clear, but the ball zipped through his hands on the MH 35. Bumgardner picked up 3 and Kimmell's pass to Shytle was good for only 2 yards. Kimmell punted out on the MH 31.

Norwood was stopped on a T-play but Kistler ran a SW reverse for 4. Fullback Ruben Waldrop picked up 3 before Center Bob Hulender downed him and A. Carpenter punted to the KM 10 to Shytle who handed off to Kimmell on a runback for 21 yards.

Kings Mountain took to the air and picked up two first downs in a row, only ones of the game. Kimmell passed to Shytle for 13 yards but on the next play lost 7 as he was rushed hard and was unable to throw. Kimmell hit Kiser on the MH 45 for 18 yards and another 1st down but R. Waldrop intercepted the next toss on the MH 20 and returned 18 yards as the game ended.

Tackle Gerald Valentine, who injured a knee in the Newton game, did not see action for Kings Mountain. Guard Robert

Junior College Leaders Collide

Boiling Springs—Saturday is the big day in the Carolinas Junior College Conference. That's the day, Gardner-Webb and Lees-McRae will settle first place in the league. Both teams own 4-0 family records.

The Bobcats, coached by Fred Dickerson, have been conference champs for the past three campaigns. Thus far this season, they have beaten North Greenville 20-0, Mars Hill 20-6, Braxton 61-0, and Asheville-Biltmore 13-0. They have a well-rounded team, using a 2-plateau system. Leading the offensive machine are David Hambrick, Bob Reid, Clayton Gilstrap, Bobby Peters, Floyd Patrick, and Joe Bolen. Bolen, star end coming from Mt. Airy, is the top point-after-touchdown maker in the J.C. Loop. Two seasons ago, G-W and the Bobcats met on the Banner Elk gridiron, with the underdog Bulldogs emerging with a 0-0 tie. The Bobcats will be 7 or 10 point favorites for Saturday's battle.

G-W has defeated North Greenville 21-19, Mars Hill 32-13, Braxton 39-0 and P. J. C. 54-0. They have rolled up 74 first downs. Davis saw considerable action although missing practice sessions for the game.
