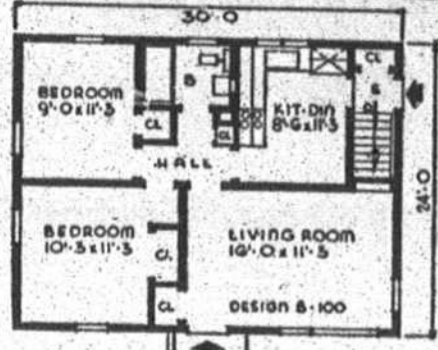
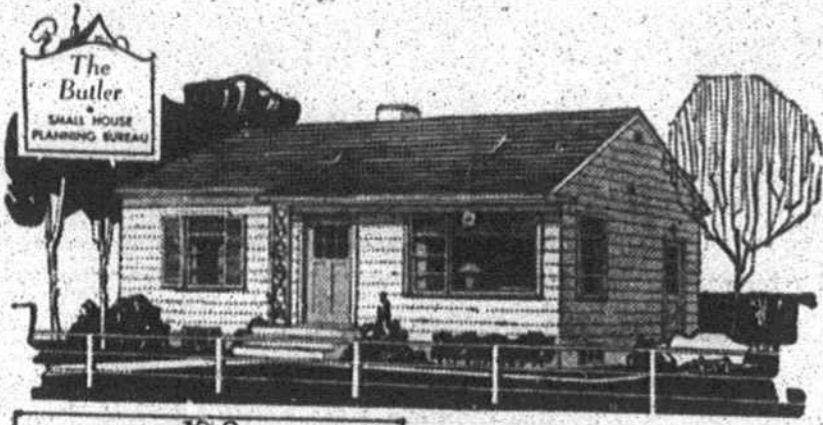


Herald "House-of-the-Week"



THE BUTLER is a compact house, ideal for the small family. It is rectangular in shape, plain roofed, with grouped plumbing for economical construction. The chimney is placed so that a combination range can be used. All rooms open into the hall, an important

feature in any plan. Each entrance has a closet, bedrooms have wardrobe closets with overhead storage space. The linen closet is in the bedroom hall. Although the rooms are not large the location of the windows allow an unusual amount of wall space for placing furniture, and for the dining space in the kitchen. A garage may be attached to black wall formed by stairway. Plans call for frame construction, siding, asphalt shingles, concrete steps, trellis at entrance and large picture window. Dimensions are 30 feet by 24 feet. Floor plan is 720 square feet, cubage 14,040. For further information about THE BUTLER, write the Small House Planning Bureau, St. Cloud, Minn.
