

THE BUTLER is a compact house, ideal for the small family. It is rectangular in shape, plain roofed, with grouped plumbing for economical construction. The chimney is placed so that a combination range can be used. All rooms open into the hall, an important

feature in any plan.

Each entrance has a closet, bedrooms have wardrobe closets with overhead storage space. The linen closet is in the bed-

Although the rooms are not large the location of the windows allow an unusual amount of wall space for placing furniture, and for the dining space in the kitchen. A garage may be attached to black wall formed by stairway.

Plans call for frame construction, siding, asphalt shingles, concrete steps, trellis at entrance and large picture window.




