Favorite RECIPES

The Herald presents this week a new feature which it will publish more or less regularly. Today's is the first group of favorite recipes of Kings Mountain women. Both recipes are ideal for the approaching holiday season. They include the recipe for orange fruit cake, a specialty of Mrs. J. W. Gamble, and cranberry salad, a specialty of Mrs. J. H. Pressley, hostess of the Kings Mountain Country Club.

Orange Fruit Cake

Mrs. J. W. Gamble
3/4 cup shortening, butter or spray.
3 eggs separated.
1 1/2 teaspoon soda.
1 cup buttermilk.
Peel of 1 orange ground.
1 package of dates.
1 cup of sugar.
1 teaspoonful salt.
3 cups flour.
1 cup nuts-pecans.
1 teaspoon vanilla.
Cream shortening and sugar together, separate eggs, add well beaten yolks, add ground nuts, dates and orange peel. Sift soda and salt with flour six times, add milk then dry ingredients, vanilla. Whip egg whites until stiff and fold in. Bake 1 hour and 25 minutes or until done. Start oven at 300 when cake starts to rise reduce heat to 250 and finish baking.

While cake is baking mix 1 cup of orange juice, 3/4 cup sugar, 1 grated orange rind set on top of stove. When cake is done pour over cake and let stand 24 hours before serving.

Cranberry Salad

Mrs. J. H. Pressley
1 pack cherry gelatin.
1 cup sugar.
1 cup boiling water.
Dissolve gelatin and sugar in boiling water, chill slightly.
Put through food chop—2 cups uncooked cranberries, pulp of 1 orange, 1 cup pecans. Add to gelatin, 1 cup pecans, add to gelatin, put in molds.
